Deploying Death-Defying Faith May 22, 2022

Today we're reminding ourselves how to fight the right fight.

So: Who's your worst enemy? Well, do you know the biggest battle you're in? Cuz you need to know that before you can know who your worst enemy really is – that cold, cruel, heartless, and horrific tormentor that'll still be standing when all other foes fade away.



The last enemy to be destroyed is death. – 1 Corinthians 15:26 NIV

That's the *only* battle that matters in the *end*. And, sorry to say, the *day* you were born, the doctor *delivered* you to the *battlefield*. But take *heart!*



The gift of *God* is eternal *life* in Christ *Jesus* [Yeshua/Salvation] our Lord. – Romans 6:23 NIV



We left off just after Jesus shut off the wind, collapsed the waves, and continued on in the darkness with His terrified boys, toward the *notorious*, *naked* and *crazy*, *screaming* Gadarene, and a *legion* of *demons*) in order to fulfill God's *Word* to *Gad*.



They sailed to the <u>region of the Gerasenes</u>, [and] When [Jesus] arrived ... in the <u>region of the Gadarenes</u>, [those are *two* of *ten* cities in the Transjordan <u>region</u> called the <u>Decapolis</u>. And then Jesus <u>does</u> something not <u>found</u> in the <u>Gospels</u>, and quite likely to His disciples' <u>horror</u>, <u>He screams</u>: "Here I am! Here I am!" And] a man with an evil spirit came from the tombs ... <u>no one</u> was strong enough to subdue him. ... [And] when Jesus stepped ashore, he ran and he cried out, – Mt 8:28; Mk 5:1-6; Lk 8:26-28 NIV



And one of the *boys* might've cried out, "Egad – we're doin' Isaiah 65!" Cuz this *moment* is *much bigger* than we *think*. No less than the *end* of an *age* is coming. And *this* guy's gonna be the *first apostle* Jesus sends out, to start *preparing* for it. So *we* need some *context*. You see, *Jesus* not only knew the *real* enemy, He couldn't get it off of the forefront of His mind.



[For example] As He was leaving the temple, [for the very last time] one of His disciples said to Him, "Look, Teacher! What massive stones! What magnificent buildings!" "Do you see all these great buildings?" replied Jesus. [Cuz here's what He saw] "Not one stone here will be left on another; every one will be thrown down." – Mark 13:1-2 NIV



By Roman legions, just 40 years later.



[Clear back] When [John the Baptist] saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming to his baptism, [this is what he was referring to when] he said to them, "Brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? ... He who is coming ... [will] gather His wheat into the barn; but He will burn up the chaff" – Matthew 3:1-2, 7-13 NKJ





15 months before Jesus' dire warning, and shortly after sending out the Gadarene, the crowd listened in as Jesus prepared to send the boys out, to take up their cross, and lay down their life, for the cause of Christ. (Mt 10:38-39) Then the boys listened in as Jesus warned the crowd to use the Word to judge what's right to fight before going before the Judge. (Lk 12:57-58) And:

There were present at that season some who told [Jesus] [a Galilean himself] about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices. [i.e. Killed 'em at the temple] – Luke 13:1 NKJ

Now Pilate *only* used *deadly* force against *insurrection;* but the Jews believed they'd be *freed* from *Rome;* so, *zealots* often *rebelled*. And being that Jesus and the boys are *Galilean* (Mk 14:70; Lk 23:6-7; Acts 2:7) *in* Galilee with a Galilean *crowd* (who think He's gonna *free* 'em from *Rome*), it's supposed that *they'll* be *blessed* with *success* if they're *more righteous* than *those* Galileans.

[Jesus] said to them, "Do you suppose that *these* Galileans were *worse* sinners than *all other* Galileans, because *they* suffered such things? I tell you, *no;* – Luke 13:2 NKJ

Those guys were just fightin' the wrong fight, having mistaken the *enemy*, in a *doomed* attempt to save *their* way of *life* by *their* own *power*. Now, Jesus had *just* said to this *same* crowd that ...

Anyone who does not take *his* cross and *follow* Me is not *worthy* of Me. Whoever *finds* his *life* [outside of *Christ*] will *lose* it, [lit. *perish* or *be destroyed*] and whoever *loses* [lit. *perishes* or *destroys*] his [*lifeless*] *life* for *My* sake will *find* it. – Matthew 10:38-39 NIV

[And now He says] But unless you repent you will all likewise perish. – Luke 13:3 NKJ



And yet just 15 months later, and just after Jesus said, "Not one stone ..." some of this very same crowd disregard His warning and demand that Pilate release *Barabbas* rather than *Jesus*, because:

Barabbas had been thrown into prison for an *insurrection* in the city, [Jerusalem] and for *murder*. – Luke 23:19 NIV

[Because] Barabbas had taken part in a rebellion. – John 18:40 NIV

And that type of fight is very tempting. So, tragically, they backed the wrong fighter, cuz they fought the wrong fight. And it's wrong because, to defeat the dark I must become the light. And to defeat hate I must become love. And to defeat death I must become life. And to become light and love and life we must wrap ourselves in the very nature of Christ. So:

Clothe yourselves with the Lord Jesus Christ, and do not [even] think about how to gratify the [dark, hateful, deadly] desires of the sinful nature. – Romans 13:14 NIV

[Cuz] The body that is sown [down here] is perishable ... [so] the perishable must clothe itself with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality. – 1 Corinthians 15:42, 53 NIV

Or [Jesus goes on to say] those eighteen on whom the tower in Siloam fell and killed them, do you think that they were worse sinners than all other men who dwelt in Jerusalem? I tell you, no; but unless you repent you will all likewise perish." – Luke 13:4-5 NKJ

We're all in this together. **Nobody** gets out of this battle alive ... without Christ. Your enemies aren't even your enemies; they're just a tactic used to distract you, by your real enemy. But:

God so *loved* the *world* that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever *believes* in Him *should not* perish but have *everlasting life*. – John 3:16 NIV

But don't confuse "should not" with "won't". Because we got'a do what only we can do, so the Lord can do what only He can do. And many simply won't. Which is tragic; because, death is dead to those alive in Christ! That's the Fighter to back! Because:

[Jesus] has destroyed [lit. unemployed] death and has brought life and immortality to light through the Gospel. – 2 Timothy 1:10 NIV

Because, in the Gospel – of Luke – Jesus provided the way of escape from death on that day.

[Saying] "When you see Jerusalem surrounded by armies, then know that its desolation is near. Then let those who are in Judea flee to the mountains, [and] let those who are in the midst of her depart ... For these are the days of vengeance, – Luke 21:19-22 NKJ

When Jesus *first* began teaching in *Galilee*, He went home to Nazareth and read from Isaiah 61, and said, "Today this Scripture is fulfilled in your hearing." *Here's* the *end* of what He read:



"[The Spirit] has sent Me to proclaim *freedom* for the *prisoners* and ... to *release* the *oppressed,* to proclaim the *year* of the Lord's *favor*." – Luke 4:14-21 NIV

But then He stops just eight words short of Isaiah's full sentence, which then says: "and the day of vengeance of our God" (Is 61:2)

[But ol' Hebrews took note, and asks] How much worse punishment, do you think, will be deserved by the one who has spurned the Son of God, and has profaned the blood of the covenant by which he was sanctified, [by the Lamb of God] and has outraged the Spirit of grace? For we know Him who said, "Vengeance is Mine" – Hebrews 10:29-31 ESV

He will be a Stone that causes men to stumble and a Rock that makes them fall. And for the people of Jerusalem He will be a trap and a snare. – Isaiah 8:14 NIV

Because *incredibly,* the Romans *used* Jerusalem and the *Passover* as a *trap, allowing* the Jews to *return* to the city for the *feast* (having rejected *Jesus* as the *true* Lamb of *God*), but then *not allowing* them to *leave* the city. But *Jesus* had *warned* His followers *when* to *flee* to the mountains.



[In fact] He wept over the city and said ... "The days of vengeance] will come upon you when your enemies [legions] will build an embankment against you and encircle you and hem you in on every side. [April 14, 70^{AD}. Then] They will dash you to the ground [like those Galileans] ... They will not leave one stone on another, [like that tower of Siloam] because you did not recognize the time of God's coming to you." – Luke 19:43-44 NIV

So whatever you do, don't miss your moment! Because 40 years after Jesus' warning to flee, the moment you see legions surrounding Jerusalem, it came to pass. Those are some of the temple stones where they fell. Here's how the ancient historian and eyewitness, Josephus describes it:

"As the *legions* charged in ... passion alone was in command. ... As they neared the Sanctuary they pretended not even to hear Caesar's commands [to spare the *renovated* temple to be *rededicated* to *Caesar*; but instead fulfilled *Jesus'* warning] ... everywhere was slaughter and flight ... down the Sanctuary steps poured a river of blood."



A million Jews were massacred; and 100,000 were taken captive; many found hiding in the sewers. These steps to the Temple were discovered in 2004, along with the Pool of Siloam where the tower once stood, and the storm drain under the stairs, was just as it was on that day, broken open by legions of Romans, and then left untouched for 2,000 years. The only group of Jews that won the battle, by avoiding the battle, were believers who recognized the time of God's coming, and repented and received their Savior, and believed His warning, and obeyed His instructions to flee to the mountains. Whereas those who fought the wrong fight, didn't believe, and didn't obey, and didn't live.

The *Galilean* massacre and the *Siloam tower* tragedy were *minor* compared to the destruction of *Jerusalem*. And *that* can't hold a *candle* to what *death* does on a *daily* basis. And the only reason it comes as such a shock when it comes, is that we spend *too* much mental *effort* avoiding the *inevitable*. And *that's* at the *heart* of the battle waged *against* us. Because:

The length of our days is seventy years — or eighty, [or even 100 like Shar's Aunt June!] if we have the strength; yet their span is but trouble and sorrow, [Cuz that's how it works down here!] for they quickly pass, and we fly away. ... [So, please Lord] Teach us to number our days aright, that we may gain a heart of wisdom. — Psalm 90:10-12 NIV

And what's this wisdom we gain from "trouble" and "sorrow"? 1) That our days are numbered; and 2) that we must daily live life in the light of eternity. Because we don't know when our number's up; but we do know we all die; but did you know we can get a jump on it by dying to sin?

When the perishable has been *clothed* with the *imperishable*, and the mortal with *immortality*, then the saying that is written will *come true*: "Death has been swallowed up in *victory*." "Where, O death, is your *victory*?" ... thanks be to *God!* He gives *us* the *victory* through our Lord *Jesus* [Yeshua/Salvation] *Christ.* – 1 Corinthians 15:54-56 NIV





That's anyone and everyone who'll receive *Him* with their whole heart. Plus, for those in 70^{AD}, He not only prepared a warning, He prepared a place of refuge in a city called Pella, in the heart of enemy territory in the region called the *Decapolis* (ten cities), right between the *Gadarenes* and the *Gerasenes*, at the base of the Mountains of *Bashan* (*Bashan* is now called the Golan Heights).

And according to early Christian historians, Eusebius c. 300^{AD} and Epiphanius c. 350, there was a well-organized mass church migration. But how'd they know *which* mountains to flee *to?* Any *guesses?* The *Bible!* Like this not-so-subtle passage in Psalm 68.

¹ Let God arise, let His enemies be scattered; let those also who hate Him flee before Him. ... ⁴ Sing to God, sing praises to His name ... His name Yah, [remember Him?] and rejoice before Him. [Maybe even hallelu Him! Because, as Isaiah said, regarding the Day of vengeance] ... ⁶ He brings out those who are bound ... [To where? Well] ¹⁵ A mountain of God is the mountain of Bashan; a mountain of many peaks [perfect for hiding!] is the mountain of Bashan. ¹⁶ ... [And for those who might be a bit slow] This is the mountain which God desires to dwell in ... ¹⁹ [Blessed be] the God of our Salvation! [Yeshua/Jesus, because] ²⁰ ... to God the Lord belong escapes from death. – Psalm 68:1-20 NKJ

And even though the Decapolis was equally hostile toward Jews, Eusebius and Epiphanius both tell us how the Gentile Christians had prepared to house and protect and hide their Jewish Christian brothers and sisters. And according to Epiphanius, it seems a certain Gadarene had a huge hand in making this happen, after putting his faith in the prized Fighter, after seeing that legions of darkness – whether deadly Romans or screamin' demons – were no match for the Light of Life.



And [so] [he] began to tell in the Decapolis how much Jesus had done for him. And [being notorious, and not naked, and not crazy] all the people were amazed. – Mark 5:20 NIV

Because *this* is one *battle* we're *all* in *together*, from the moment we're *delivered* till the moment ... well, we're *delivered!*

And they're just beginning to see the light!

And I can't wait to tell you why!

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Father God, thank You for loving me in spite of my sin; forgive me and cleanse me by the sacrifice of Your Son, my Savior; and free me and lead me by Your Spirit and Word, as I seek to trust and follow Jesus Christ, as the Lord of my life. Amen.
