## Glorious Riches

Choosing to be Cheerful and Blessed
September 25, 2022

## Today we're talking about giving till it no longer hurts!









Who wants to be blessed? Raise your hand. "Don't do it ... he's tricking us." Jesus begins His Sermon on the Mount with, "Blessed are the poor ... the hungry ... the heartbroken ... and the hated." Seems, blessed are the broken and the broke. So now who wants to be blessed? Let's take an offering! "I told you he was tricking us." I just want you to be blessed. And blessed are the poor ... so give ... till it no longer hurts.

As you *Philippians* know, [writes Paul] in the *early days* ... when I set out from <u>Macedonia</u>, not *one* church shared with me in the matter of *giving* and *receiving*, except you *only*; [What's up, *Macedonia*?] for even when I was in Thessalonica, *you* sent me aid *again* and *again* when I was in *need*. [Not *greed*] Not that I am looking for a *gift*, but I am looking for what may be credited to your account. [Which is what *I'm* doing] I have received full payment and *even more* ... [the *gifts* you sent] are a *fragrant offering*, an *acceptable sacrifice*, *pleasing* to God. And *my* [*true*] God will meet all *your* [*true*] *needs* [not *greeds*] *according to* His *glorious riches* in Christ Jesus. – Philippians 4:15-19 NIV

The big mistake of the name-it-and-claim-it prosperity doctrine, isn't in expecting God's blessing in response to faithful giving; it's in *dictating* what we'll accept as a *blessing*. At the top of "His glorious riches" list is *eternal life*, and *life-giving light*, and *fathomless love*. Then there's joy and peace and all the fruit of the Spirit, strengthening our relationships. And waaay at the bottom would be worldly wants and wishes. Because, our Savior isn't an investment scheme.

But we tend to upend the order, like a child ignoring the gift and playing with the box. Two things stand out in today's passage: **the Philippians'** *generosity* **toward the Lord;** and **God's** *gloriosity* **toward the Philippians** (that should *totally* be a *word*). That incredible promise, that "God will meet all your needs according to His *glorious riches* in Christ Jesus," is directed at those who are "*pleasing* to God" with "*fragrant offerings*" and "*acceptable sacrifices*".

<sup>1</sup>Therefore [writes Paul] be imitators of God as *dear* [pleasing] children. <sup>2</sup> And walk in love, as ... an <u>offering</u> and <u>a sacrifice</u> to God for a [fragrant] <u>sweet-smelling aroma</u>. ... <sup>10</sup> finding out what is <u>acceptable</u> to the Lord. ... <sup>25</sup> [who] loved the church and gave Himself for her ... <sup>27</sup> that He might present her to Himself <u>a glorious church</u>, – Ephesians 5:1-27 NKJ

... <u>fully pleasing Him</u>, being fruitful in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God; strengthened with all might, according to His *glorious power* – Colossians 1:10-11 NKJ

... according to the *glorious Gospel* of the *blessed* [pleased] God – 1 Timothy 1:11 NKJ

And those Macedonians were all about "finding out what is acceptable [pleasing] to the Lord".

[So] We want you to know about the grace that God has given the Macedonian churches. Out of the most *severe* trial, their <u>overflowing joy</u> AND their <u>extreme poverty</u> welled up in <u>rich generosity</u>. [Way to go, <u>Macedonia!</u>] For ... they gave as much as they were able, and <u>even beyond their ability</u>. [Sacrificially!] Entirely on their own, [Voluntarily!] they <u>urgently pleaded with us</u> [Eagerly!] for the privilege of sharing – 2 Corinthians 8:1-4 NIV











Jesus called Peter, Andy, Jim, and John to *leave* their *livelihood*, to be *fishers* of *men*. And they went out without *money*, *lunchbox*, or *suitcase*. And then returned ... to being fishers of fish. For *one night*. Not *one bite*. (Lk 5:5) And Jesus waits till All is put away the next day, to say, "We should go fishing!" Cuz it's all about who's in your boat. And *Peter pouts*, till Jesus *flexes* His *miracles*, and then he *repents* as his boat is *sinking* under the weight of God's *blessing*. (Lk 5:5-8) And *then* Jesus has 'em *leave* it *all* on the *shore* for the *poor*, and *hikes* 'em up that *hill*, and *prays* all *night*, and *appoints* 'em as His *twelve apprentices*. (Lk 6:12-13)

And [that's the context for when] He came down with them [following] and stood on a level place, [with them behind, on the hillside] with a great crowd of His [regular] disciples and a great multitude of people ... And He lifted up His eyes on His [hillside] disciples, and said: "Blessed are you who are poor, [on account of Christ; as we'll see in verse 22] for yours is the kingdom of God. Blessed are you who are hungry now, [on My account] for you shall be satisfied. Blessed are you who weep now, [on My account] for you shall laugh. Blessed are you when people hate you [on My account] and when they exclude you [on My account] and revile you [on My account] and spurn your name as evil, on account of the Son of Man! Rejoice in that day, and leap for joy, for behold, your reward is great in heaven; for so their fathers persecuted the prophets who were before you.—Mt 5:12; Lk 6:17-23 ESV

And one of 'em *must've* said, "Did He just call us *prophets!*" Jesus isn't *teaching* the *crowd* that *poverty, hunger, grief,* or *rejection* are *good;* He's *reassuring* His *faithful* that, **if troubles come from following** *Him,* **you'll be** *blessed* **in** *ways* **you can't** *imagine.* Literally. Not created with the capacity. And **He often disguises the lead-up to** *victories* **as** *calamities* **and** *tragedies;* cuz how else could we *flex* our *faith* and *triumph?* So *take heart!* Cuz *He* was tested as *we,* in every *way,* (Heb 4:15) and *He* overcame the *cross!* So **don't** *define* how the Lord should express His love. Cuz He's told us how He *will:* He'll never forsake us; *and* He'll work all things to our eternal best; *and:* 

"In Me you may [or may not] have peace. [Your choice. But] In this world you will have trouble. [Not your choice; and also translated: affliction, tribulation, persecution, and suffering] But take heart! I have overcome [also translated: defeated, conquered, and (my personal favorite) won the battle with] the world." – John 16:33 NIV

It's not: "I have OVERCOME the world," as in: "So don't worry; I've conquered it *for* you," it's "I'VE overcome the world," as in: "So don't worry; YOU can TOO!" Which is how and why, we can be truly *blessed and* truly *troubled*. They're not *mutually exclusive*.















"For the joy set before Him [He] endured the cross". (Heb 12:2) And He's saying to His boys: "Due to your faithfulness, your money's gone, you've gone hungry, and you've been harassed ... but, if you could see what I can see, you'd be jumpin' for joy!" That's no scheme, it's an eternal sure-thing! This rich believer dies, and as Jesus walks him to his mansion, they pass some very impressive heavenly homes. One is reserved for his godly chauffer; another for his saintly maid; another for his devout gardener. Then they come to a ramshackle shed, and Jesus says, "This is all yours! And we're quite proud of it." The guy says, "That's it? And You're proud?" Jesus glances around and graciously whispers, "With what you sent ahead, I'd say we pulled off a minor miracle!"

The best example of giving in Schindler's List isn't Schindler. We watched when he collapses with regret, after being given a gold ring. But just before that scene, a Jewish man is drinking vodka, and everyone's saying "Thank you, Mr. Jereth." And we don't get it, till they pull out his crowns to make the ring. And Mr. Jereth, knees buckling, grins, blessed, with a bloody rag to his mouth. I don't know if the contrast was intended; but in back-to-back scenes, neither man can stand. One is held up because of a joyful, painful offering. The other can't stand because of the weight of grief-stricken regret. In Malachi, just before the Lord accuses His people of robbing Him, He promises ... and warns, that:

"The Messenger of the covenant, whom you desire, will come ... [but] Who can stand when He appears? [For] He will sit as a Refiner and Purifier of ... gold and silver. Then the Lord will have men who will bring offerings in righteousness ... Will a man rob God?" – Malachi 3:1-8 NIV

Not without robbing himself of glorious riches. Cuz the golden crowns cast down up there, must be laid up down here. (Rev 4:10) And only those who are pleasing will still be standing when regret weighs in. If only we had specific instructions about the collection for being God-pleasing. Oh wait:

About the collection for God's people ... On the first day of every week, [oh, consistency] each one of you should set aside a sum of money [oh, intentionally] in keeping with his income [oh, proportionally] – 1 Corinthians 16:1-2 NIV

Add that to the Macedonians: *sacrificially, voluntarily,* and *eagerly,* and we have the *recipe* for a *fragrant offering.* And yet, *none* of that *pleases* the Lord, *unless* it pleases us. Paul writes:

Each of you should give what you have *decided* in your *heart* to give, [Have you *made* that *decision?*] not *reluctantly* or under *compulsion*, for God loves a *cheerful* giver [Mr. Jereth] [That's what pleases our Father!] – 2 Corinthians 9:7 NIV

It's a no-win situation for believers who feel guilty when they don't give and reluctant when they do. But cheerful generosity allows God's gloriosity. So why are we so quick to make that list: big house, better job, good health, and maybe set a new car in my driveway. Doesn't my scheme seem reasonable? It's fine to ask for those things; just don't expect them as wages for your faith.



So, *are* you a *cheerful giver?* How do you *feel* when an *offering plate* passes, or you pass a *legitimate*, *reasonable* need? *Privileged? Eager?* Reluctant? Pressured? Unconcerned?



There is one who makes himself rich, yet has nothing; and one who makes himself poor, yet has great riches. – Proverbs 13:7 NKJ



Because, we can *leave* it *behind* in a box of *pine*, or *put* it on *His account*. Ever been to an *estate sale*? People *pawing* through *piles*, and *stacks* of the *stuff*, that represent someone's brief *stay* down *here*. And for a few bucks you can get a *whole box* of their *old*, *leftover stuff*. Well, **Jesus wants us to think** *outside* of that *box!* Which means, to ...



Conduct yourselves throughout the time of your stay [down] here in [righteous] fear; knowing that you were not redeemed with corruptible things, like silver or gold ... but with [the "glorious riches" of] the precious blood of Christ, – 1 Peter 1:17-19 NKJ

If you're honest and giving and generous and kind on *His* account, and the result is *less* in *your* account *on His account*, you'll be *jumpin'* for *joy* when you give an account. "For what does it profit a man to gain the whole world, and forfeit his soul?" (Mk 8:36 NAS) *Nothing!* Know what that dung beetle is singing? "I've got the whole world in my hands!" In one sense it *is* a *blessing* to be *deprived*. Because **deprivation reminds us of our actual dependence on God.** In fact, the more *earthly security* and *comfort* we store up, the more we must remind ourselves of our desperate need. Hence the *flipside*, on that hillside, directed at those having a *ball*, being *seemingly blessed* with *religious authority* and *worldly wealth*.



"But woe to you [false believers] who are rich, [It's coming in verse 26] for you have received your consolation. Woe to you [false believers] who are full now, for you shall be hungry. Woe to you [false believers] who laugh now, for you shall mourn and weep. Woe to you, [false believers] when all people speak well of you, for so their fathers did to the false prophets." – Luke 6:24-26 ESV

And one of 'em must've said, "Did He just call us false prophets?" Jesus' load is light, because of joy and purpose and meaning; whereas this world's heavy, broken, "dung-ball" system — in stark contrast to Peter's boat sinking under the weight of God's glorious riches — is like the Titanic listing under the burden of its own overconfident luxury! And woe to those finding false meaning in the ballroom in the bowels of a ship in the fleeting moments while still topside!

Because there's only One who is the Way, the Truth, and the Life boat. Cuz it's about who's in your boat. And it's a troubling journey down here. So, who wants to be blessed? Well then, reach out, grab hold, hang on, and faithfully follow. And use whatever's within your grasp to help others survive the voyage. For what does it profit a man to lose the whole world and gain his soul? Everything! And then some! Cuz we can't even imagine.

Father God, thank You for loving me in spite of my sin; forgive me and cleanse me by the sacrifice of Your Son, my Savior; and free me and lead me by Your Spirit and Word, as I seek to trust and follow Jesus Christ, as the Lord of my life. Amen.
