## Ugly Feet

Two Confessions of True Faith
September 24, 2023

## Today we're talking about the two confessions of true faith!













Two Sundays back, we covered the sometimes unpleasant and unappealing process of warming up to righteousness to restore life, and building up belief beyond the shivering demons of James 2:19. So we focused on bowing to Jesus' identity and authority and mission. And apparently I missed my opportunity. Because after 2nd service, Chris Vargas comes up and says, "Why didn't you reveal the acronym?" And I said, "What acronym." And he said, "Identity, Authority, and Mission." And I said, "Iam?" And he said, "I AM!" And I whisper-shouted, "Wait everybody ... the sermon's not finished! There's an acronym ..."

Today's question: Are you a believer, or a confessor, or a friend?

Cuz we can only be one of these three. Every congregation has four categories: 1) Believers who don't profess (their faith); 2) Professors who don't believe (as they profess); 3) Believers who profess (what they believe); and 4) Skeptics who don't profess what they don't believe. Which is Jesus' favorite group? #3! These followers He calls friends.

[Jesus said] "You are My friends if you do what I command. I no longer call you servants, because a servant does not know his master's business. Instead, I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from My Father I have made known to you ... and appointed you to go and bear fruit—fruit that will last." – John 15:14-16 NIV

Now here's where it gets interesting: Which is His 2nd favorite group? #4! Remember His wish?

"You [#1 and #2] are neither cold nor hot. I wish you were either cold or hot. So, because you are lukewarm ... I will spit you out of My mouth." – Revelation 3:15-16 NAB

Jesus openly expressed His contempt and disdain for hypocrites, but when ...

[The *Pharisees*] complained to His *disciples*, "Why do you *eat* and *drink* with *tax* collectors and sinners?" Jesus answered them, "It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick. I have ... [come to call] sinners to repentance." ... "and you say, 'Here is a glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax collectors and sinners." — Luke 5:31-32; 7:34 NIV

Well, they got *one* out of *three!* So, if *He came* as a *friend* to *sinners* and *skeptics* – who *suffer* in the *darkness* down here, what do you *suppose* is the "*fruit* that will *last*" that He *appoints* His *faithful friends* to *bear* on His *behalf?* You see, there are *two confessions* of *true faith*. First off:

If we *claim* to have *fellowship* with Him yet <u>walk</u> in the <u>darkness</u>, [down here] we *lie* and <u>do not live</u> by the <u>truth</u>. ... [But] If we <u>confess</u> our <u>sins</u>, He is <u>faithful</u> and <u>just</u> and will <u>forgive</u> us our <u>sins</u> and <u>purify</u> us from <u>all</u> unrighteousness. – 1 John 1:5-9 NIV

That's the confession we're all familiar with. But there's also one called **The Good Confession** or **The Word of Faith**, wherein we don't confess our sin so much as our Savior. As Paul reminds Timothy:

[You] made the good confession in the presence of many witnesses. – 1 Timothy 6:12 NAS

[Having written that] The Word [of faith] is near you; [if] it is in your mouth and in your heart," that is, the Word of faith we are proclaiming: [from Deut. 30:14, where it says, "The word is ... in your mouth and in your heart, that you may do it"] that if you confess with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, [freed from the guilt of sin – if you're sin'cere] and it is with your mouth that you confess [what's in your heart] and are saved. As the Scripture [Is 28:16] says, [serving as Paul's summation for confessing what we believe] "Anyone who trusts in Him will never be put to shame." – Romans 10:8-11 NIV

Because it isn't belief alone that saves. Even the shuddering demons believe. Nor is it a matter of simply saying the right things. Salvation comes to anyone who trusts in Jesus. And the only way to trust is to act on what you believe, and do what Jesus asks us to. Because a trusting heart is eager to make those two true confessions. One mostly private. One mostly public. Because:

Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved. ["Yay!" But] How, then, can they call on the One they have not believed in? ["Um"] And how can they believe in the One of whom they have not heard? ["Well"] And how can they hear without someone preaching to them? And how can they preach unless they are sent? As it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!" — Romans 10:13-15 NIV



Compared to the *ugly feet* of *non-confessors*, and *professors* who *walk* in *darkness*. "But, *who's* being "sent" and *who's* doing the sending?" Well ...

"Oh." So how beautiful are your feet? Many of the religious rulers of Jesus' day believed in their heart that He was the Christ/Messiah. For instance ...



[Jesus said] "As the Father has sent Me, I am sending you." – John 20:21 NIV

There was a man of the *Pharisees* named *Nicodemus*, a member of the *Jewish ruling council*. He came to Jesus at *night* [talk about walking in darkness] and said, "Rabbi, we know You are a teacher who has come from *God*." [Trouble was: ugly feet] – John 3:1-2 NIV



The [same ruling council of the] Jews had already agreed that if anyone confessed Him to be Christ, he was to be put out [as in kicked out] of the synagogue. – John 9:22 NAS

[So] Among the [70-member council of] rulers <u>many believed</u> in Him, [as <u>Christ/Messiah</u> (like the <u>demons</u> did)] but because of the Pharisees [who <u>did not</u>] <u>they did not</u> [<u>publically</u>] <u>confess Him</u>, [as Christ] lest they should be put out of the synagogue; [and so, even though they <u>believed in Him they shuddered</u> at the thought of <u>publically confessing Him</u>] for they loved the praise of <u>men more</u> than the praise of <u>God</u>. – John 12:42-43 NKJ

They knew it was most likely true — they just wouldn't stake their life on it. But until we do, our faith's not so true. I said the one good thing about demons is their theology on Jesus' identity; cuz they came out crying out, "You are the Christ!" (Lk 4:41) So add this to that list: even the demons were willing to publically confess Jesus as the Christ! And I hear their feet are like hooves! So, how beautiful are your feet? Cuz it has a lot to do with whose approval you most desire. It's common to be afraid of losing popularity or position (cuz you might) when it comes to our profession of the Good Confession of our Savior among our peers. Which is why Jesus exhorts and warns that:

"Whoever confesses Me before men, him I will also confess before My Father who is in heaven. But whoever denies Me [down here] ... him I will also deny before My Father" [up there] – Matthew 10:32-33 NKJ



















But, don't get those frightened, believing Pharisees wrong; they loved the praise of God ... they just loved the praise of their unbelieving peers a bit more. So they kept their true thoughts and feelings to themselves. But it's not called the Good Thought or the Good Feeling; it's the Good Confession. And I like that word; because the best way to share the Good News of our Savior, is by confessing the faults and flaws and fears from which we're being saved! Jesus' greatest proofs are His works-in-progress that He's producing. So these fearful leaders tried believing without confessing; but, speaking of demons, there's a wild story about some foolish leaders who tried confessing without believing!

[The Seven sons of Sceva, a Jewish chief priest] tried to invoke the *name* of the Lord Jesus over those who were demon-possessed. [But they refused to call Him "Lord", so] They would say, "In the name of Jesus, whom Paul preaches, I command you to come out." ... One day the evil spirit answered them, "Jesus I know, and I know about Paul, but who are you?" [Great question! Not a friend of the Friend of sinners] Then the man who had the evil spirit ... gave them such a beating that they ran out of the house naked and bleeding. [It's comical because the evil spirit has more belief in Jesus than those trying to cast it out!] ... Many of those who believed now came and openly confessed their evil deeds. A number who had practiced sorcery brought their scrolls together and burned them publicly ... the value of the scrolls ... came to fifty thousand [silver] drachmas. In this [very public] way the Word of the Lord spread widely and grew in power. – Acts 19:13-20 NIV

Because the most powerful way to share is to show the impact of the Lord in your life. In stark contrast to this dark world, our sincerity and transparency and authenticity demonstrates our trust in Jesus' identity and authority and mission. And – you ready for this?! The acronym is lam!

Ever know someone who practiced *sorcery?* Back in college, I ran children's shoes at Bullock's in Sherman Oaks. And the lady running children's clothing, next to me, was a self-proclaimed *white witch*. Like *Glinda*. I really *enjoy* being around *unbelievers*. I'm not *threatened* by *unbelief*, or *offended* by *worldly ways*. No. Instead, I'm *curious* and *concerned*. And *baby*, if you're a *practicing witch*, I got *questions!* So I *peppered* her, cuz I *had* to know *what* she *believed* and *why*. And if she *made potions* and *did spells* and *said incantations* and *wiggled* her *nose* like on *Bewitched*.

And at some point *she* peppered *me*. And, *given* the *opportunity*, I *gladly shared* the *salt* of my *faults* and *flaws* and *fears* and *Savior*. Like a *friend*. I was only there a few *months*. And I didn't *see* any *results*. However, when I told her that I was *leaving*, she told *me* that I was one of her *only real friends*. And she asked me why I had to *go*. So, to *lighten* the *moment*, I *teasingly* said, "The Lord told me my work here is done." And she starts *crying* and says, "I prayed last night, for the first time, and asked God to give me whatever it is you have." Then, I started *crying*.

You see, it's vital that we verbalize our faith. Cuz that's what makes it our faith! "Scripture says, 'Anyone who trusts in Him will never be put to shame.'" (Rom 10:11) Oh, people will try. Jesus said:

"If the world hates you, [just] keep in mind that it hated Me first." – John 15:18 NIV

Oddly comforting. Cuz, try as they might, I can't be put to shame for trusting the sun to come up, the tide to go out, and the Lord to live in my heart! Plus, sharing what Jesus is doing in your life isn't an option, it's an assignment! Because the responsibility of salvation is to pass the salt.

**So, how beautiful are** *your* **feet?** I can *tell* you what *size shoe* you *need,* but **your** *true* **foot appeal is between you and those in search of a Savior.** Paul was mostly quoting Isaiah, who wrote:

[How beautiful] are the feet of *Him* who 1) brings *Good News*, who 2) proclaims *peace*, who 3) brings *glad tidings* of *good things*, who 4) proclaims *salvation* – Isaiah 52:7 NKJ









That's what we in the biz call a size 4! But did you notice that Paul's "feet" are slightly larger than Isaiah's "feet". Paul changes "the feet of HIM" to "the feet of THOSE". Know why? Because Isaiah is referring to the feet of the Christ – whose name, Jesus, in Hebrew is Yeshua (lit. "Salvation"). And how beautiful are the pierced feet of Him who first proclaimed the peace and goodness of Yeshua. Which the Father sent Yeshua himself down to do; and He did; and now sends out His faithful friends to follow in His footsteps.

So how beautiful are your feet? It's got nothing to do with aesthetics. This old boat ain't much to look at, but if it risked itself to bring relief and to rescue you from certain death, you'd later say something like, "That ol' hunk of junk was the most beautiful thing I'd ever seen!" Because true beauty is based on the life that it brings. And Jesus' sandaled ol' soles were quite likely calloused, and ultimately, eternally scarred. But, according to the OT prophet Nahum, these beauties are truly in the eye of the beholder.

[Behold] the feet of Him who brings good news, who publishes peace! – Nahum 1:15 ESV

Jesus is not only the Author of salvation, (Heb 5:9) He's far and away the most successfully published Author in human history! The world knows Jesus, and it knows about Paul, but who are you? Hopefully a friend. Because you know why He leaves us down here after we're saved? To make those two true confessions. Cuz there are two things we can't do up there: sin; and share our heart with friends who don't yet know Him. And He sure as heaven didn't leave us here to sin!

So let's beat feet and bear the fruit that'll last for all eternity!

Father God, thank You for loving me in spite of my sin; forgive me and cleanse me by the sacrifice of Your Son, my Savior; and free me and lead me by Your Spirit and Word, as I seek to trust and follow Jesus Christ, as the Lord of my life. Amen.
