## My Truth

## Escaping the Errors of Our Ways October 8, 2023

Today we're talking about *practicing* the *right righteousness*, in order to *turn* from the *errors* of our *own ways*. So answer this: Is *your* truth *the* truth?















Anybody remember my UCLA parking garage story? Returning from a night class; a car horn starts blaring on the level just above me. And the big-citypeople can't seem to stop it. But I'm a small-town wrecking yard boy. I know how to disconnect a horn, and I'm ready to help. So I run up the ramp to the rescue! But the owner apparently left. Most cars had a hood latch in the grill. But this car was new and nice, with the latch inside and the doors locked. But the driver's wing window was open, so I let myself in. But I can't find the hood release. So I get on my knees, brush some broken glass aside, and lean in for a closer look. Now, I was the hero in MY truth ... until THE truth broke in: the wing window isn't open, it's broken! By a thief! Just a couple minutes before! And that horn is a then-modern alarm! And security's coming! And my hands are up under the dash! So I dashed to the nearest, darkest, corner and hid in the shadows ... only to realize that this is what the thief would've done when I ran up the only ramp out! So I ran to my car, raced home, and really thanked the Lord for protecting an idiot from prison. Cuz I don't think I could've convinced anyone that I was that stupid. But I was! I was that stupid. My truth, indeed!

That's what Paul would call zeal without knowledge. He writes about it, saying:

[The Israelites] are zealous for God, *but* their *zeal* is not *based* on *knowledge*. Since they did not know <u>the *righteousness* that comes from God</u> and sought [His Word] <u>to establish</u> <u>their own</u>, they did not submit <u>to God's righteousness</u>. – Romans 10:1-4 NIV

So we need to practice the right righteousness, that makes us undeservedly holy, rather than the self-deceiving, self-righteousness that makes us unwittingly hollow. It's not about belief alone, or just saying the right things. It's about trusting. And trusting is all about practicing.

For by one sacrifice He has <u>made perfect</u> forever those who are <u>being made holy</u>. – Hebrews 10:14 NIV

[Now] If you know that He is righteous, you may be sure that everyone who <u>practices</u> righteousness has been born of Him. [Cuz we're talking about practicing] – 1 John 2:29 ESV

No one born of God makes a <u>practice of sinning</u> ... he cannot <u>keep on</u> [practicing] <u>sinning</u> ... By this it is evident who are the <u>children of God</u>, and who are the children of the devil: whoever does <u>not practice righteousness</u> is <u>not</u> [born] of God - 1 John 3:9-10 ESV

[In fact] Whoever <u>practices</u> righteousness is righteous, as He is righteous. [Whereas] Whoever makes a practice of sinning is [a child] of the devil – 1 John 3:6-8 ESV

My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you ["who are being made holy"] may not sin. [Cuz we're talking about our practice] But if anyone does sin, we [who are practicing righteousness] have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ [who happens to not only be the Truth, but] the Righteous. – 1 John 2:1 ESV



Cuz we're talking about our Savior! One of life's great joys is when children mature beyond a parent-child relationship and become actual friends. Well, the more we practice the right righteousness, the more intimately we walk with our Father as a faithful friend. Because, just like a mature son or daughter, our appreciation deepens for what we couldn't formerly comprehend. Being born (again) of God is a beginning. You're either His redeemed child or you're not. But being made holy is a journey, because friendship deepens as it grows. As a true believer you can't become more of God's child; but you can become a far better friend. Cuz He's the friend of sinners.

Did you know that Scripture says "truth fails"? Under certain conditions. You see, we see things the way we want, even when it's wrong. It's called Confirmation Bias. It's a tendency to see only that which confirms our beliefs while ignoring anything that contradicts.

Remember when I was cruising through *Bellingham* late one *night, years* ago? As I drove through an intersection I noticed the stoplights were hung *backwards*. I thought: that's *weird*. As I shot through the 2nd intersection, same thing! I thought: that's *dangerous; somebody* is *really stupid*. This time I was the *victim* in my truth ... until the truth hit me at the 3rd intersection: I'm stupid! It's a one way street! I reflexively slammed on the brakes, skidding sideways into the intersection, heart pounding. My truth, indeed! We can sincerely cruise along the wrong way with deadly consequences. Because, my truth only works until it collides with the truth. And when we enter the Word of Truth to support a feeling, desire, or agenda – rather than to examine ourselves and seek the actual truth – we'll find the proof we want, to believe the "truth" we want. Which blinds us to the actual truth and makes us a prey for false teachers. Isaiah said:

Woe to those who [ignorantly or knowingly] call evil good, and good evil; who put darkness for light, and light for darkness – Isaiah 5:20 NKJ

They trust in *empty words* ... [and then] We *look* for *light*, but there is *darkness!* For *brightness*, but we *walk* [unaware] in *blackness!* ... For truth is fallen in the street, and [true] equity cannot *enter* [the picture]. So <u>truth fails</u>, and he who [rightly] *departs* from *evil* makes himself a *prey*. – Isaiah 59:4-15 NKJ

A prey to those with zeal without knowledge. Because truth fails when it's mishandled. And it's mishandled if and when we pick and choose what we want to read to believe to receive to live by, while willfully, ignorantly, imposing our own biased ways on God's Word. Paul said that those are those that are sincerely zealous for God, "but their zeal is not based on knowledge". It's sincere and passionate, but mishandled and misdirected, and therefore fails. But:

He who speaks [THE] truth declares [the RIGHT] righteousness – Proverbs 12:17 NKJ

[Whereas] The backslider in heart will be filled with his own ways – Proverbs 14:14 NKJ

[Which is why] It is *not good* to have <u>zeal without knowledge</u> ... [because] A man's own folly ruins his life, yet his heart rages against the Lord. – Proverbs 19:2-3 NIV

Because, based on sincere but biased, mishandled, empty words, the Lord's to blame! Until I saw my own way for what it was, I could only conclude, by my truth that Bellingham signal-light installers are idiots! But once I saw the truth behind those lights, and the error of my own way, I hit the brakes so hard it spun me around and left skid marks! Ever hear someone say: it doesn't matter what someone believes, as long as they're sincere? Well, I beg to differ. As I've learned firsthand:

He who trusts in *himself* is a *fool*, [like *me* barreling through the *first two* intersections] but he who walks in wisdom is kept safe. – Proverbs 28:26 NIV

You see, **God gave His Word to His Children.** And it did *not* require them to *earn* their *own* salvation, but **to** *trust* **in** *His mercy,* so that *righteous obedience* would *flow* from *joyful gratitude*. **But they ended up using** *His Word* **to quantify** *their righteousness.* More than once they had to be reminded that whenever it comes to God's blessings:

It is *not* because of *your* righteousness – Deuteronomy 9:6 NIV

And yet, like many of us, they continued to resist the right righteousness of seeking the truth, and instead: "Sought to establish their own". Which is why we're given the very same warning:

When the kindness and love of God our Savior appeared, He saved us, <u>not because of righteous things we had done</u>, <u>but because of His mercy</u>. He saved us through the washing of rebirth ["by one sacrifice"] and [ongoing] renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom He poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior ... And I want you to stress these things, so that those who have trusted in God may be careful to devote themselves to doing what is good. – Titus 3:4-8 NIV





**Devoting ourselves to doing good is a** *response* **to God's** *mercy,* **not a** *means* **to it.** Which means *doing good* must be rooted in *receiving grace*. Cuz the *more* we *receive,* the more our *love* will *grow* until *obedience* becomes a *byproduct* of *gratitude*. I saw a T-shirt that said: "Jesus Loves You! (and in small print) Then again He loves everybody." The humor plays on a tendency to feel less valuable if we don't somehow stand out from the crowd — which tempts us to compare ourselves to those we feel free to *judge,* as being *beneath* us — which is dangerous when it comes to our righteousness. For instance, where are you on a scale of 0-10 for righteousness? Two? Three? Four? Well, the *devil's* a zero, so Hitler's gotta be a *one* or *two,* right? I mean, he's *Hitler,* but he's not the *devil.* "Hmm. Hitler's a *one* or *two?* I guess I'm like a *five.*" But *drug pushers* who sell to *kids* gotta be like a three or *four.* I mean, they're *drug pushers,* but they're not *Hitler.* And *where* do you fit *kind-hearted atheists,* or *half-hearted Christians?* 

See how we eventually and fairly easily get faithful followers to a nine? And if you tithe, attend church, pray, read Scripture, serve in ministry, and give to the Philippines (beyond your regular giving), you gotta be like a 9.7! And that's the danger of driving this direction in the dark! Cuz even if you're trying to be humble, you can't help but see you're near the top in your truth. For all I know, Hitler is a one or two; and you may well be a 9.7 ... but the scale isn't 0-10. It's 0-infinity!











All of a sudden there's not much difference between a one and a 9.7. But until we submit our way of establishing our own righteousness to the Way, which is Jesus, we'll define our righteousness in ways that deceive ourselves rather than drive ourselves to our knees in His light. Because, if you're a nine point something, what's the big deal? Well:

[God] made *His* light shine in *our* hearts to give us *the* light of the *knowledge* of the glory of God in the face of *Christ*. *But* we *have* this treasure in <u>jars of *clay*</u> [in *order*] to *show* that this *all-surpassing power* is from *God* and *not* from *us*. – 2 Corinthians 4:6-7 NIV

We gotta get it through our *thick head* and *hard heart* that we're *profoundly lovable*, but *completely unacceptable* – like a *lovable* child *sprayed* by a skunk. I grew up *fully aware* that I was a *very much loved little stinker*; know why? Anybody remember those personalized mugs all the *kids* had in the *60s?* I still have mine. But it didn't say "Bruce" ... it said "Little Stinker"! And it's *because our* Father gave *His* kids *freewill*, that we need to be *continually renewed*, *reset*, and *recalibrated*. And He did this because He's determined to have a family, and to have *all us little stinkers* in it!

The Lord, the Holy One of Israel, saves you, and He says ... "I am the One who wipes away all your sins. I do this to please myself. I will not remember your sins. But you should remember Me. Let's meet together and decide what is right." – Isaiah 43:14, 25-26 ERV

If you're a *genuine* child of our Father-God, you can't *stink* of *sin* without something inside alerting you to the fact that *something* doesn't *smell right*. Well, *tomato juice* might work with *skunk*, but an *ongoing washing* of God's *Word* is *required* for those practicing the *right* righteousness. Because:

[Christ] loved the church and gave *Himself* for her, ["by *one* sacrifice"] that He might sanctify and cleanse her with the [ongoing] washing of water by the Word, that He might present her to Himself a glorious church, not having spot or wrinkle or any such thing, but that she should be [made] holy and without blemish. – Ephesians 5:25-27 NKJ

**We're all heading in wrong ways in ways we're unaware of.** So we need to focus our zeal on examining ourselves in light of God's Word, and step on the gas, or slam on the brakes, or whatever it takes to make an immediate course-correction. Because, like Paul:

This is my prayer [for you]: that your love [for your Father] may abound more and more in knowledge and depth of insight – Philippians 1:9 NIV

Cuz we're talking about *practicing* ... the truth ... with zeal!

Father God, thank You for loving me in spite of my sin; forgive me and cleanse me by the sacrifice of Your Son, my Savior; and free me and lead me by Your Spirit and Word, as I seek to trust and follow Jesus Christ, as the Lord of my life. Amen.
