Thanks For Nothing

Appreciating Withholding
November 26, 2023

Today we're learning to thank God for what He holds back! Cuz His love isn't *only* seen in what we *have*, but what we *lack!* So, today's question is: **What's the best thing God** *hasn't* **given you?** There's *a lot* to choose from; just think back to every *unanswered prayer* and take your pick!

And while we're *ruminating* on our *answer*, let's remind ourselves of an all-time *favorite* gift that God says He *does* give:



Come to Me, all you who are *weary* and *burdened*, [which is all of us btw...] and I will give you rest. – Matthew 11:28 NIV



Now we're talking! Who doesn't love rest?! Just imagine unwrapping a single week of real, worry-free, put-your-feet-up rest this Christmas... it'd be the best gift you ever got! Cuz we're all weary and burdened and aching for all the rest we can get! Like this little break between holidays that comes after the constant chaos of family and cooking but before the consuming craziness of more family and Christmas. Cuz all we really need is a little peaceful pause to get a grip on some rest, right? Then why did the Guy who gives us rest say this:



Do not suppose that I have come to bring *peace* to the earth. <u>I did not come to bring peace</u>, but a sword. – Matthew 10:34 NIV



Wait, what?! How does God give us rest without peace? And why exactly did He pack a sword?

Well, I hate to be the bearer of Good News, but Jesus came to start fights and light fires! Cuz He knows us better than we do – and peace isn't the productive part of our path to rest!

And we know that because we had it back at the beginning and it didn't take! It was already all good in the Garden and it was us who made the original fuss! And because we weren't content with God's peace and quiet, He kicked us out to let us learn what restless work was all about! And after living this life of relentless labor, I don't know about you, but I'm ready for the rest!

Which is exactly how God's plan works – He does *whatever* it takes for us to learn our lesson. And when the easy way won't work, the hard way works wonders! So, even if it stings a bit:

Blessed is the one whom God corrects; so do not despise the discipline of the Almighty. For He wounds, but He also binds up; He injures, but His hands also heal. — Job 5:17-18 NIV

And we know all about how well this approach to teaching works, cuz oftentimes, pain is part of the tough love tactic used to crack hard hearts. Sometimes we need to be scared straight, sometimes we need ultimatums in an intervention, and sometimes we just need a healthy dose of Christmas movies. Cuz that's a genre that's all about spreading peace and goodwill on earth – yet suspiciously, every star of the story seems to need tough love to learn those lessons!









I mean it took time-traveling ghosts to show how *bleak* Ebeneezer Scrooge's broken life was before *he'd choose* to build it *back up!* It took a guardian angel *erasing* George Bailey from existence to teach *him* to love and *appreciate* the life *he* wanted to *leave behind*. And it took a *lifetime* of *misery* and *mistakes* to move the Grinch from *misanthrope* to *Mr. Wonderful!*

So, in *our* life's little movie, if all or *our* restless chaos is written by a *loving God*, we should *all* be *wondering*, *all* the time, **what's the purpose of my lack of peace?** What's the *lesson* I'm supposed to *learn* as the star of *my* story?

Because if a loving God *is in control*, **He'll only allow our hurts and hardships if they're absolutely necessary parts of the path to perfection.** So let's look at *three possible purposes* God holds His peace in the middle of *our* mayhem:

First, when God withholds something we want – but can't quite reach, He demonstrates our deficiency. He shows us there's some things even our hardest work won't ever supply. You ever notice the weird reason God kicked us out of the Garden so quickly:

[Adam] must not be allowed to reach out his hand and take also from the tree of life and eat, and live forever. So the lord God banished him from the Garden of Eden to work the ground from which he had been taken. – Genesis 3:22-23 NIV

We had to go or else we'd stay alive! Why wouldn't He want that? Well, cuz there's a lot to learn from the fear of death! In fact, all adversity reveals our inadequacy. And our unwinnable battle with death is a constant reminder of how much we all miss real life. And seeing what we're missing is huge — cuz we gotta know what we lack before we can want it back! Just ask a fish!

Y'see, fish don't know they're wet. And how could they? When something is everywhere you can't notice it anywhere. Yet, the second you take a fish out of water, they know all about it. They need it to breathe. They need it to move. They need it to live. And as they start drying and dying, all fish instantly know they want the water back! Well likewise, when God kicked us out of His perfect presence, only then did we learn how He was the key to our life! Cuz He is the living water that we didn't know we needed til we started drying and dying. And that's still part of the plan:



[God marked humanity's] appointed times in history and the boundaries of their lands. God did this <u>so that they would seek Him and perhaps reach out for Him and find Him</u>, though He is not far from any one of us. 'For <u>in Him</u> we live and <u>move</u> and <u>have our being.</u>' – Acts 17:26-28 NIV



Some things are impossible to appreciate until we experience life without them and all our restless reaching apart from God gets us to really ponder the life-giving peace of His presence. Because, despite the discomfort, sometimes, we have to learn lessons against our will; it's called discipline and nobody's a real big fan of the feeling:

No discipline seems pleasant at the time, but painful. Later on, however, it produces a harvest of righteousness and peace for those who have been trained by it. – Hebrews 12:11 NIV

Only the fear of *death* truly teaches the *love* of *life*. Only *vulnerability* truly teaches *humility*. And only **being saved truly teaches trust**; which brings us to our *second* purpose in God withholding His peace: He **illustrates His sufficiency**. Cuz once our *deficiency* has us *reaching* for real life, we start seeing what *it* really *looks like*; so every minute we're *dying* for what we're *missing*, **we're learning to love what leads to living!**







The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of His being, sustaining all things by His powerful Word. After He had provided purification for sins, <u>He sat down at the right hand of the Majesty in heaven.</u> – Hebrews 1:3 NIV



God's presence *died* – despite all *their* efforts to *survive*. So when *Jesus* became the first person to defeat death, **we saw sufficiency where all other humans had deficiency**. And when someone actually achieves our *objective*, it only makes sense to try and follow in their footsteps.

Y'see, prior to Jesus, every single human who lived a life apart from



If Christ has *not* been raised, your faith is futile; ... But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead – 1 Corinthians 15:17,20 NIV

And so, the billion dollar question becomes, how did He do it?! Well, by being "the exact representation of [God's] being". He was the perfection that sustains all things. He was the source of living water that all us flopping fish need to live! And He came to call us home:

You who once were far away have been brought near by the blood of Christ. <u>For He Himself</u> is our peace [as a bridge between certain death and living water] — Ephesians 2:13-14 NIV

[Cuz God sent Jesus] to reconcile to Himself *all things*, whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making peace through His blood, shed on the cross. – Colossians 1:20 NIV

So, here's the surprise: God doesn't give peace, He gives Jesus! And that's way better – it's like getting the fountain after asking for a sip. And that's when we learn real peace isn't the absence of adversity; it's the presence of Jesus! And the more we come to know Him, the more God teaches us it's the relationship, not the rules that keep paradise perfect! Just like a fish needs to be in water to stay alive, we need to be in God's presence to stay alive. And that can only happen through a relationship with Jesus. So no wonder there's always a subtle stipulation to every gift God wants to give – did you notice it in the beginning? Jesus said:

Come to Me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. – Matthew 11:28 NIV

God's got everything we need to live, but by keeping things in His Son's hands, His withholding accomplishes a third important purpose He provokes our pursuit! And this is of critical importance to God's plan cuz actions speak louder than words and we need a trustworthy way to sincerely say we regret walking away from the relationship. So what could be a better demonstration of our desire for restoration than pursuing the peace we previously left? Like Peter says of the righteous:


They must turn from evil and do good; they must seek peace and pursue it. - 1 Peter 3:11 NIV

[So] Let us therefore make every effort to do what leads to peace – Romans 14:19 NIV

[And guess who leads us there? Well, Jesus said] I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father [And His life-giving presence] except through Me. - John 14:6 NIV

[So no wonder He said] Do not suppose that I have come to bring *peace* to the *earth*. I did not come to bring peace, but a sword. – Matthew 10:34 NIV







It's the same reason my wife and I work hard each year to make sure every Christmas morning starts off with pain and frustration. Cuz every kid in our family wakes up to a notecard that leads each kid to conquer more clues in a sinister scavenger hunt that takes them everywhere from car trunks to toilet tanks before revealing their biggest present of the year. And why do I keep it up with my kids? Cuz I'm pure evil!



But beyond that, it makes them all aware and inspired. It puts 'em in the present. Otherwise, it's possible to passively receive gifts without ever being awake enough appreciate what we're given. But, when we make the effort to pursue our prize, it captures our attention and makes us mindful of our motivation. Pursuit forces our focus and communicates what we appreciate. And that's just what our relationship with God needs to be restored; deliberate decisions to demonstrate devotion!



So, yes, God's gonna give us that peace that brings real rest – but it must come after we come to Him. So, He holds His peace to teach us to grab hold of Him! Because when we're weary and burdened by our life of labor apart from Him, we'll naturally be driven to the One who holds the perfect peace we're constantly craving; and in His presence, find our rest!

Look, there's some *misinformation* going around these days, but **your life isn't about feeling good**, **it's about learning good**. And *nothing* teaches us to appreciate *rest* like *exhaustion*, and nothing teaches us to appreciate *peace* like *chaos*. Cuz nothing teaches us to appreciate *comfort* like *pain*.

[But remember,] Though [God] brings grief, He will show compassion, so great is His unfailing love. For He does not willingly bring affliction or grief to anyone. – Lamentations 3:31-33 NIV

So, when we wonder why God won't give the peace we so desperately want this holiday season, don't hate, appreciate! Tough love is still love and if you're feeling like God's not giving you the peace you want It just means He's reminding you that He has what you lack – and coming to Jesus is how He gives it all back!

For the Lord God is a *sun* and *shield*; The Lord will give grace and glory; No good thing will He withhold from those who [what] walk uprightly. [Where? To Him!] - Psalms 84:11 NKJ

So thank the Lord for holding His peace, it might just be what leads to Him holding you!
