## Hard Rock Hearts

Joining Our Living Cornerstone
March 31, 2024

Today is our Easter celebration of Jesus' resurrection! He is risen! He is risen indeed!



















And if we *love* the Lord with *all* our *heart*, and *believe* in our *heart* God raised Him from the *dead:* We will rise! We will rise indeed! Which is why it's wise to scrutinize our heart. So I ask: What shape is your heart in? We think of a heart as being this shape. When, in reality, it's this shape. No one is sure where the shape we associate with a heart originates, but everyone agrees that it's simply the shape of the mirror image, of two hearts united as one, in a way no man could separate. Which is from Adam's speech in Eden, regarding himself and Eve; and it's from Paul's quote in Ephesians ... regarding Jesus ... and us. Saying:

Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her ... to present her to himself as a radiant church, without stain or ... blemish, but holy and blameless. ... "For this reason [quotes Paul] a man will leave His father and mother and be united to His wife, and the two will become one flesh." [Adding] This is a profound mystery—but I am talking about Christ and the church. — Ephesians 5:25-32 NIV

Behold! The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! - John 1:29 NKJ

[To whom the Lamb vowed] "I will give you a new heart and ... remove from you your heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh." – Ezekiel 36:26 NIV

[Explaining] "I will give them an undivided heart" [of flesh] – Ezekiel 11:19 NIV

And the two (united hearts) will become one (undivided) flesh! That no one can separate! So:

Let us *rejoice* and be *glad* and give Him *glory*! For the *wedding* of the *Lamb* has *come*, and His *bride* has made herself *ready*. – Revelation 19:7-9 NIV

[So] Why then do you harden your hearts? – 1 Samuel 6:6 NKJ

We think of a *Biblical* millstone as being *this* shape. When in *reality*, it was this shape. These are in *Capernaum*, Jesus' old *home office* and *Headquarters*, on the *Sea* of *Galilee*. And that's the *lower half*. And *that's* what *Scripture* compares to the *hard* heart of a *seriously strange symbolic* king: Leviathan, the *serpent* of the *turbulent sea!* God himself told *Job*, that:

His heart is as hard as stone, even <u>as hard as the lower millstone</u>. ... [And] He is king over all the children of pride [hardened, un-united hearts]. – Job 41:24, 34 NKJ

This millstone comparable isn't a coincidence. The lower half resembles an un-united heart of stone, that the Lamb vowed to remove when His children are called to humble and soften their heart, to be united with a very different stone: our Cornerstone, the Rock of our salvation! Cuz we:

Come to *Christ*, [the King of kings] who is the Living Cornerstone of God's temple. He was rejected by the [hard-hearted and half-hearted] people, but He is precious to God who chose Him. And now God is building you, as living stones, into His spiritual temple." – 1 Peter 2:4-5 NLT

"For indeed, [Jesus said] the kingdom of God is within you." – Luke 17:21 NKJ

Don't you *know* [asks *Paul*] that <u>you yourselves</u> are God's <u>temple</u> and that God's Spirit lives in you? ... God's <u>temple</u> is <u>sacred</u>, and <u>you are that temple</u>. – 1 Corinthians 3:16-17 NIV



But we think of a cornerstone as being this shape. But that's so Roman. In reality, temples and synagogues in Jesus' day, especially in Galilee, and specifically in Capernaum, were this shape! Cuz they were built with pillars; and that's how they're joined together in the corner! And, be it coincidence or providence, that's the shape of two hearts of flesh united as one. And:



[You are] God's building. [Declares Paul; and] By the grace God has given me, I laid a foundation as a wise builder, [We'll see in a moment why he's a wise builder] and someone else is building on it. [Cuz we're in this together] But each one should build with care. For no one can lay any foundation other than the One already laid, which is Jesus Christ. — 1 Corinthians 3:9-11 NIV



They took Him down from the cross and laid Him in a tomb. – Acts 13:29 NAS



[And after that] [Peter] said ... "Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified ... is the Stone which was rejected by you builders, which has become the Chief Cornerstone ... for there is no other name under heaven ... by which we must be saved." — Acts 4:8-12 NKJ



[And before that, Simon-Peter famously said] "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." And Jesus answered him, "Blessed are you, Simon ... you are Peter, [lit. a rock] and on this Rock [of the Living Christ] I will build My church, [with like-minded, albeit imperfect, rocks like you] and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it." — Matthew 16:15-18 ESV

"Therefore everyone who hears these words of Mine [says Jesus] and <u>puts them into practice</u> is like [Paul, who called himself] a wise man who built his house on the Rock." – Matthew 7:24 NIV

[Cuz] You also, [just] like living stones, are being built into a spiritual house – 1 Peter 2:4-5 NIV

Beholding as in a mirror the glory ... transformed into the same [mirror] image - 2 Corinthians 3:18 NKJ

[Which means] God's household, which is the church [the bride and mirror image of the glory] of the living God, [is built into] the pillar and [built on the] foundation of the Truth. – 1 Timothy 3:15 NIV

Know why? Cornerstone pillars were built by stacking heart-shaped cross sections. Which is why:

All who are victorious will become pillars in the Temple of My God – Revelation 3:12 NLT

Therefore, you are ... [fellow] members of the household of God, having been <u>built</u> on the <u>foundation</u> of the <u>apostles</u> and <u>prophets</u>, [with] Jesus Christ <u>Himself</u> being the <u>Chief Cornerstone</u>, in whom the <u>whole</u> building, <u>being fitted together</u>, grows into a <u>holy temple</u> in the Lord, in whom you also are <u>being built together</u> for a <u>dwelling place</u> of <u>God</u> in the <u>Spirit</u>. – Ephesians 2:19-22 NKJ



[Cuz the Lamb made His vows, saying] "I will give them an undivided heart and put a new spirit in them; [and] I will remove from them their [heavy burden of a lone] heart of stone and give them a [united] heart of flesh." – Ezekiel 11:19 NIV



[In Revelation, an angel says] "I will show you the bride, the Lamb's wife" ... holy Jerusalem ... having the glory of God. [And] Her Light was like a most precious stone, like a jasper stone ... [And maybe that's because] The first [i.e. chief] foundation stone was jasper [which is usually red; blood red] — Revelation 21:9-11, 19 NIV

And be it coincidence or providence, it looks like that guy's holding a heart in his hand!

[Now] He will be as a sanctuary, but [also] a Stone of stumbling ... a snare to the inhabitants of Jerusalem. And many among them shall stumble; they shall fall and be broken – Isaiah 8:14-15 NKJ

They stumble, being disobedient to the Word – 1 Peter 2:8 NKJ

[And] Because of your stubbornness [NKJ: hardness] and your unrepentant heart, you are storing up wrath against yourself for the Day of God's Wrath – Romans 2:5 NIV

Is not My Word [warns the Lord] ... like a hammer that breaks the rock in pieces? – Jeremiah 23:29 NKJ



And be it *coincidence* or *providence*, those are *hearts* of *stone*, that the Lord *removed*, albeit *by* the *Romans* (in 70<sup>AD</sup>), but *just* as He'd *warned* 'em, when:



His disciples came up to show Him the *buildings* of the *temple*. [In *Jerusalem*] And Jesus said ... "Not *one* stone shall be left *here upon another*, that shall not be *thrown down*." — Matthew 24:1-2 NKJ



And 40 years after the sacrificial death and resurrection of the Lamb, those very temple stones were quite literally thrown down, where they remain to this day! And the Romans also scattered the stones of every synagogue in Israel, and iconically in Galilee, leaving hard rock hearts littering the landscape of the legalists. But, when Jesus was born, He was dedicated in that same temple, when Simeon the prophet warned Mary:

[That] "This Child is appointed for the fall and rise of many in Israel ... and a sword will pierce even your own soul ... that thoughts from many hearts may be revealed." – Luke 2:34-35 NAS

Which is why Peter so passionately proclaimed to the massive crowd on the Day of Pentecost:

"God has made *Him* both *Lord* and *Christ*—this *Jesus* whom *you* crucified." Now when they heard this, <u>they were pierced to the heart</u>, and said ... "What shall we do?" ... "[Repent and] be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins" — Acts 2:36-38 NAS

[For] By His power God raised the Lord from the dead, [He is risen indeed!] and He will raise us also. [We will rise indeed!] ... [For] the two will become one [united heart of] flesh." But [that's symbolic, because] whoever is united with the Lord is one with Him in Spirit. – 1 Corinthians 6:17 NIV

Those hard rock hearts are still hanging around Jesus' old headquarters. And they're bigger than you think; notice the foot. And get this: rejected cornerstones and pillars were pierced, to be repurposed as anchors. Not to be cast into the sea, but to be laid along the shores of Galilee, for securing boats. And:

Jesus Christ [our Living Cornerstone, rejected and pierced] [is] ... our hope – 1 Timothy 1:1 NKJ

[And] We have this hope as an anchor for the soul – Hebrews 6:19 NIV

Because, He's the pierced Cornerstone that secures the tie that binds our hearts as one. So:



Be strong and take heart, all you who hope in the Lord. – Psalm 31:24 NIV

[Because] Christ is faithful as a Son over God's house. And we are His house, if we hold on to our courage and the [anchor of our] hope of which we boast. ... [So] Encourage one another daily ... so that none of you may be hardened by sin's deceitfulness. – Hebrews 3:6-13 NIV



Because, as sure as that serpent came into God's garden ...



"Temptations to sin are sure to come, but woe to the one through whom they come! It would be better for him if a millstone were hung around his neck and he were cast into the sea" – Luke 17:1-2 ESV



You see, down here, every life begins with an isolated heart, separated from our Savior, being devoid of God's Word, and in dire need of His Anchor of Hope. And our heart is already hung around our neck by our jugular, just counting the beats till we get to go home. But the longer we leave it on its own, the stronger it hardens into stone. So:



Let your heart keep My commandments [whole-heartedly] ... let not steadfast love and faithfulness forsake you; bind them around your neck ... [and] trust in the Lord with all your heart — Proverbs 3:3-6 ESV



[Cuz] The Lord gave [Moses] the two tablets of stone [which, by coincidence or providence overlap to form a heart of stone — Deuteronomy 9:11 NKJ

[And therefore, and likewise] Judah's sin is engraved ... on the tablets of their hearts [of stone] - Jeremiah 17:1 NIV

But the Lamb made a vow to "write it on their hearts" (Jer 31:33) "of flesh". (Ezek 36:26) So then:

Show that you are a letter from Christ [to all the divided hearts He died for] ... [written] with the Spirit of the living God, not on tablets of stone but on tablets of human hearts. ... For the letter [of the Law] kills, but [a letter from] the Spirit gives life. – 2 Corinthians 3:3, 6 NIV

[Because] He only is my Rock and my Salvation; [lit. Yeshua/Jesus] — Psalm 62:2 NKJ

[And] The Lord lives ... the Rock, my Savior! – 2 Samuel 22:47 NIV

[So] Let us shout joyfully to the Rock of our salvation. – Psalm 95:1 NKJ

He is risen! He is risen indeed!

[And] Though my flesh and my heart fail, God is the Rock of my heart – Psalm 73:25-26 NAB

Because our heart is the new home office, and our mind the headquarters of His Kingdom! And so, in what shape is your heart: a lone millstone or united Cornerstone?

Father God, thank You for loving me in spite of my sin; forgive me and cleanse me by the sacrifice of Your Son, my Savior; and free me and lead me by Your Spirit and Word, as I seek to trust and follow Jesus Christ, as the Lord of my life. Amen.
