Fixed Metaphors

Finding Meaning in Our Story

Today we're exploring how God uses this world to communicate His Word. Cuz from seeds to stones, He sure seems to love making metaphors out of our everyday lives. But the more symbolic His speech, the more meaning we can miss — like last week; who ever considered that literal cornerstones might unlock mountains of meaning! So, it's vital that we learn to slow down to look around for anything profound in the everyday lives we lead. Cuz every little word from God is a huge step toward life; and to hear them all, you gotta ask: Where is God speaking to you?



Now, here at *His Place*, I know *most* of you wanna raise your hand to say, "Duh, He speaks through His Word, I thought you were a pastor." And you're right; but, are you sure you're picking up everything God's laying down? Cuz even when we're listening, it's easy to miss a meaning.



For example, you ever go to a good action *movie* and walk out thinking about *car chases* and *kung fu* while your more *brainy* buddies are discussing the deep *symbolism* and clever *metaphors?*



Inception, The Matrix, and The Life of Pi are all action-packed, but also meant to make us contemplate the nature of the actual truth we trust. While Harry Potter, The Lord of the Rings, and Star Wars all intended to get us philosophizing about our personal relationship with good and evil. And WALL-E, Avatar, and King Kong all snuck in subtle messages about humanity's dangerous relationship with nature. Did you catch 'em all?



It's okay if not, cuz those are 'hidden meanings' and by definition, they're supposed to be buried beneath the surface. But — the whole reason we hide them comes from how happy humans are to find them! Because the chemical for pleasure, dopamine, is directly connected to all the things that could lead to a potential payoff. Y'know how Pavlov's dogs started salivating at the ding of a bell because it meant dinner was approaching? Well, anticipating a reward really rings our bell, too! We actually get high on searching and seeking when it leads to digging and finding!



And that means we're all wired to look for hidden meanings because unearthing anything previously unseen has the same pleasurable payoff as a treasure hunt. And besides, just look around – all human history makes it easy to see: finding meaning is a drug we're all addicted to!



But here's why all that matters; when God decided to communicate His Word – the signature style of His speech was the same as our favorite filmmakers: seemingly straightforward stories, with a hidden, deeper meaning! Especially when explaining Scripture to His disciples:

With many similar parables <u>Jesus spoke the Word to them</u>, as much as they could understand. <u>He did not say anything to them without using a parable</u>. – Mark 4:33-34 NIV

And just in case we'd ever *question* whether the *hunt* for more meaning in *His* Word was worth *our* effort, **Jesus explicitly** *promised* **the satisfying** *payoff* **that motivates our pursuit:**

I say to you: Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. – Luke 11:9 NIV

But, although that's great, you gotta wonder, what's the point? Why wire us to want this whole 'hide and seek' hunt for hidden meaning instead of just laying it all out plainly?



Well, there's at least three good reasons for all the metaphoric meaning and symbolic stories: 1. They help us receive the truth, 2. They help us perceive the truth, and 3. They help us believe the truth. And those are critical helps cuz His Word can only save us when we hear it, understand it, and ultimately live it! Which are the steps Paul praises for followers:



[We] thank God continually because, when you <u>received</u> [into your heart] the Word of God, which you heard from us, you accepted it not as a human word, but [perceived it] as it actually is, the Word of God, which is indeed at work in [the lives of] you who <u>believe</u>. – 1 Thessalonians 2:13 NIV



So, to see how symbolic words help us through these steps, let's start with how they help us receive the truth. Cuz we can't do anything with truth until we actually obtain and retain the truth. It's our top priority:



[Like God commands Ezekiel:] Receive into your heart all My words that I speak to you, and hear with your ears. – Ezekiel 3:10 NKJ



But the truth *is,* the truth is *big!* And if you've ever tried to teach anybody *anything,* you know our attention span is *small.* I mean, the *pinnacle* of our *information exchange* has been reduced to *tweets, shorts,* and *memes.* Why? Cuz learning is hard and we like easy! So, for us to hear *out* and hold *on* to massive amounts of *information,* it needs to feel as *effortless* as social media *scrolling.* And thanks to God, *it is.*

You ever hear of a memory palace? It's a method that we've used throughout human history when we need to remember a lot of specific stuff. In fact, most World Memory Champions (yes, it's a thing!) use it to memorize hundreds of faces, abstract images, and over a thousand digits in under 30 minutes. And all we have to do is attach new information to things we already know; like your home. So, if your bed represents the number 1, your slippers are attached to 5, and the bathroom is a 7 – you can remember the number 1-5-7 by imagining you woke from bed and put on your slippers to go to the bathroom. All we really have remember is the everyday life we lead.

And is it hard to memorize the location and purpose of your car, dishwasher, or lawnmower? No! That's just life; life is a huge collection of people, places, and things that we experience and remember without effort. And that means we're ready to attach and remember new ideas to millions of things we already know – like seeds, soil, fruit, stones, pillars, and hearts. Life is our enormous and unforgettable memory palace just waiting for new meaning.

And again, we *know* this is God's M.O. cuz He tells us *plainly* how He *always intended* for things like the *shallow* religious practices of everyday *OT life* to lead us to His *deeper*, *hidden* truth:

[About the first covenant, the tabernacle, the priests, holy bread, ark, altar, and holy of holies, we're told:] This is an illustration for the present time, indicating that the gifts and sacrifices being offered were not able to clear the conscience of the worshiper. – Hebrews 9:9 NIV

The law is only <u>a shadow</u> of the good things that are coming—<u>not</u> the <u>realities</u> themselves. For this reason it can never, by the same <u>[symbolic]</u> sacrifices repeated endlessly year after year, make perfect ... But those sacrifices are an annual <u>reminder</u> of sins. – Hebrews 10:1-3 NIV

And atoning for sins is a very real concept we must remember! So sacrifice was made a symbolic component of life so we'd have something to attach God's bigger truth to. And in the same way, this whole life is full of shallow things waiting to reveal their deeper meaning. So don't get it backward, truth doesn't depend on this world, this world depends on truth. Everything God created down here is a simplified and symbolic shadow of an infinite and incredible reality up there!



Here's why that's great: Whether we catch the intention or miss the meaning; the symbols stick; just waiting for us to find the meaning. And once you see this world as the memory palace created to catalogue and connect us to the truth hidden in His Word, then all those strange symbols in Scripture start to help us perceive the truth.



For since the creation of the world God's invisible [aka *hidden*] qualities—His eternal power and divine nature—have been clearly seen, being *understood* from what has been made, – Romans 1:20 NIV



And that's a necessary step, cuz understanding the truth is what makes it worth remembering. In fact, perceiving is the second half of receiving:



[Like God commands Ezekiel:] Receive into your heart all My words that I speak to you, and hear with your ears. – Ezekiel 3:10 NKJ

Which essentially means, "Dig for the deeper meaning!" Cuz it's what God asks after His Word has already been heard. It's more like the English expression, "Give ear to my words." – asking for the listener to make an effort to truly pursue the meaning of what's being said.

And sometimes, it takes seeing the meaning in symbolic story to dig up and discover the message hidden in our own lives. Like the time King David was somehow oblivious to his own adultery and murder in the Bathsheba blunder and his prophet Nathan, wanted him to see his sin. Nathan had to make up a shallow story about "some rich guy" who stole and killed some poor guy's "sheep" so David could see the deeper dilemma more easily. And sure enough:

David burned with anger against the man and said to Nathan, "As surely as the LORD lives, the man who did this must die! He must pay for that lamb four times over, because he did such a thing and had no pity." Then Nathan said to David, "<u>You are the man!</u> [You big dummy!] – 2 Samuel 12:5-7 NIV

Sometimes we're just too *close* to something to *see* it; and that's when **it takes a shift in perspective to finally get the picture.** If we can catch the *same message* hidden in a *different story*, it can start a chain reaction of *understanding the meaning* in our *own* lives. That's how watching WALL-E might make you an *environmentalist* and Lord of the Rings can *inspire* stronger moral convictions. Cuz metaphors can compress life's complex concepts into easily *understood* images.

And as we start to *perceive* what we *receive*; those previously unseen layers of *new* meaning **help** us *believe* the truth. Because hearing and understanding is only half the battle, **believing the truth** means rejecting the rest. And it's part of the main reason *Jesus* gives His disciples for His speech:



This is why I speak to them in parables: "Though seeing, they do not see; though hearing, they do not hear or understand. In them is fulfilled the prophecy of Isaiah: "'You will be ever hearing but never understanding; you will be ever seeing but never perceiving. [Why?] For this people's heart has become calloused – Matthew 13:13-15 NIV



Y'see, the Pharisees received God's Word, but wouldn't dig deeper to perceive it and that revealed what their hearts really believed. Cuz our pursuit proves our purpose and passion. If we believe we already have the whole truth, we won't dig deeper — but if we trust there's still more to see that only God can give, we'll follow Him until we find the real meaning and real reward that really rings a real believer's bell!



Jesus said, "For judgment I have come into this world, so that the *blind* [but *believing*] will see [deeper] and those who [think they *already*] see will become blind." Some Pharisees ... asked, "What? Are *we* blind too?" Jesus said, "If you *were* blind, you would not be guilty of sin; but now that you claim you *can* see, your guilt remains. — John 9:39-41 NIV



For the [weirdly written] Word of God is alive and active ... <u>it judges</u> the thoughts and attitudes of the heart. – Hebrews 4:12-13 NIV

By being full of strange symbols that continue to confuse those too prideful to pursue God's help.

For God is not the author of confusion [Shallow believers are; cuz] – 1 Corinthians 14:33 NKJ

Where envy and self-seeking exist, confusion and every evil thing are there. – James 3:16 NKJ

So, Where is God speaking to you? Literally everywhere! But the real question is, are you listening? Because you can't receive and perceive the deeper meaning hidden in your life until you truly believe all truth does depend on God's Word. So, do you? It's easy to tell: when you're having trouble finding meaning in any area of your life, are you turning to His Word? And just how passionate is your pursuit? Ask yourself. And answer honestly.

Sometimes it seems easier to sit through life as a simple and somewhat satisfying movie without worrying about any deeper meaning – but here's the question: why would you accept that when we're wired to enjoy life as an action-packed, mind-blowing, blockbuster?! You wouldn't!

But, if you have, it just takes three things to flip the script: an open heart, and an open mind, and an open Bible. Cuz that's how we pursue the only Author with words that give our life real meaning.

Father God, thank You for loving me in spite of my sin; forgive me and cleanse me by the sacrifice of Your Son, my Savior; and free me and lead me by Your Spirit and Word, as I seek to trust and follow Jesus Christ, as the Lord of my life. Amen.
