Rest In Peace

Christmas' Calming Conquest
December 15, 2024

Today we're finding the personal peace that comes from our confidence in Christmas. Cuz worry is all about "what if" — while confidence is all about "what is" — and Christmas is our annual reminder that "what is" true has already defeated all our "what if" worries. So, the big Christmas question is: are you at peace? And are you sure? Do you know what that really means?



Cuz it's not *just* Christmas carols that make *peace* a big part of Christmas, it's the Christmas *Scriptures* that put *peace* at the *center* of the story:



[Like when the *angel* announced Jesus' birth to the *shepherds*, saying:] "You will find a Babe wrapped in swaddling cloths, lying in a manger." And suddenly there was *with the angel* a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying: "Glory to God in the highest, And <u>on earth *peace*</u>, goodwill toward men!" – Luke 2:12-14 NKJ



Now that's *classic* Christmas – *peace* on earth and *goodwill* toward men! Our *Savior* was *born* to *end* all our *battles* by bringing us *peace! Right Jesus?*



Do *you* think I came to bring *peace* on earth? <u>No</u>, I tell you, but *division*. [But... I thought the angel *just said*...] – Luke 12: 51 NIV

Do *not* suppose that I have come to bring peace *to the earth*. I did *not* come to *bring peace*, but a *sword*. - Matthew 10:34 NIV

Oh. Well, that's kind of a *bummer*. Cuz if sweet lil' baby Jesus came to *stir things up*, that kinda changes the *vibe* of all our Christmas cards. And if His *birth* marked the *beginning* of a *battle*, *which one* and with *whom?* Well, *fortunately*, when Mary and Joe took *Jesus* to the *temple* for His *baby blessing*, the *Spirit* moved a guy named *Simeon* to come *share* some insight:

"This child is destined to cause the falling and rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be spoken against, so that the thoughts of many hearts will be revealed. And a sword will pierce your own soul too." [Which makes sense cuz when Jesus was born] – Luke 2:34-35 NIV

The Word became flesh and made His dwelling among us. [And]— John 1:14 NIV

The *Word* of God is alive and active. Sharper than *any* double-edged *sword*, it penetrates even to dividing *soul* and spirit, joints and marrow; [So, whether bound in a *book* or born as a *baby*] it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart. – Hebrews 4:12 NIV

Y'see, just like the Bible, how we handle *Jesus* reveals what we have in *our hearts*, cuz in the end, **Jesus didn't** *just* come to *save* us, but to *teach* us we *need* saving! He came from the *other side* to show us *what* side *we're* really *on* – so we could make sure we're on the *winning* team *before* the battle ends. And just by being *born* into *this world*, Jesus helped us see the *three things* that our heart has to know to be saved: we're at *war*, we're on the *wrong* side, and *surrender* means *victory*.

And it all starts with making us see we're at war! And all that took was a visitor from the other side – cuz conflict is revealed when opposition nears. It's easy to think we're easy going till the going gets tough and our choices get challenged. It's why so many marriages fail these days! We can pretend everything's perfect as long as we can control our personal space, but when intimacy allows an outsider into the heart of our camp, we have to compromise our will to accommodate their will – and them's fightin' words! So, similarly, it's easy to think we get along with God until He invades our space to reveal we don't want to accommodate His will.



And when *Jesus* was born into *humanity*, we were asked to accommodate perfect *love* and *truth* – which *revealed* we were *opposed* to it:



This is the verdict: <u>Light has come into the world</u>, but <u>people loved darkness instead of light because their deeds were evil</u>. Everyone who does evil hates the light, and will not come into the light for fear that their deeds will be exposed. – John 3:19-20 NIV



Y'know, we got a saying down here: **The truth hurts.** And it's *NUTS* that we all kinda *accept* it – cuz it means *we're at odds* with what is *right!* But it's *true*, we fight to *refute* it, *revise* it, or *refuse* it – because down here, the truth *convicts*, *corrects*, or *condemns* us – and that's just plain *painful* to a person trying to *pretend* that *they're* already on the "good guys" side. But, *remember*, Jesus came "to be a sign that will be spoken against; *so that* the thoughts of many hearts will be revealed." And going *against* the only one *from* the "good guys" side, was meant to *teach* a hard *truth* to hard *hearts:*



And just by entering *this* world, Jesus made us *admit* that the human heart in its *natural* state is *opposed* to God – cuz the mere presence of *His true righteousness* in *our world* revealed the prevailing *feeling* wasn't just *opposition* but violent *aggression*.



[Like Paul says simply:] The mind governed by the flesh is hostile to God; it does not submit to God's law, nor can it do so. – Romans 8:7 NIV



I mean Herod went on a *genocidal rampage* in response to just the *rumor* of *baby* Jesus threatening his power! Because the reality *is*, **we're at war** *with* **God.** And it's our *sin* that separates the *two sides* – *our* side has a soft spot for it while *God's side* gives it a hard "no." But making us *admit* that we're at war is just *step one* of God's battle plan; *next* he wants us to defect.

Cuz the birth of Jesus didn't just reveal we're at war with God, it showed us that we're on the wrong side. And this one is just embarrassingly easy to know, cuz if truth rubs us the wrong way, it should be obvious we're on the wrong team. I mean righteousness is on His side... which kinda makes any opposition wrong-eousness. And that's why the Pharisees had such a hard time finding Him guilty – all His actions and words were helpful, healing, and holy! And that kind of irrefutable evidence sure makes it hard to hold on to a belief that we're the "good guys." But once again, this was all by design; cuz to get us to change our allegience, first He had to challenge our confidence in our goodness. And all that takes is showing us a better, more believable truth.



Which is actually a popular war tactic! You ever hear of leaflet bombs? They're bombs filled with information aimed at changing the enemy's perspective to try and get them to defect before another battle. We used them all the time in WWII to let Germans know what an untrustable monster Hitler really was and the atrocities that were really going on. They were literally "truth bombs" - and were effective enough that the Germans tried to counter with their own. But it's easy to tell who has truth on their side when you see each approach. For example, a popular German leaflet showed a passionate couple kissing and read: "FAREWELL! Remember her last kiss? Gee were you happy then! Together, you spent marvelous times, lounging on beaches, dancing, enjoying parties galore, listening to the tunes of your favorite band." Whereas one of the more effective Allied leaflets had no words, but simply depicted a large open field with thousands of German graves. Cuz real truth is revealed by reality, not rhetoric. And in addition to these truth bombs, the US dropped surrender passes that promised safety to all who switched sides!

And although just *possessing* such a pass was punishable by *death*, 77 percent of all Germans who surrendered had one *on them*. I guess deep down we *all* recognize *good guys* by *mercy* and *grace*!

And it worked for Jesus too! Cuz Christmas wasn't just about bringing God's Son into the world as a sacrifice – Jesus' incarnation was God's invasion! And baby Jesus was the biggest truth bomb ever dropped on humanity! After God papered our planet with His Word for a few thousand years, He decided to go nuclear by packing all of His goodness into Jesus to make His Word flesh! And just like the Allies' airborne leaflets, God's newborn Truth Bomb promised peace to those willing to risk leaving the lies of their old side to join the good guys! Like Jesus said:

Peace I leave with you; <u>My peace I give you</u>. [But,] I do not give to you as [your old side,] the world gives. [So,] Do not let your hearts be *troubled* and do not be *afraid*. – John 14:27 NIV

[Cuz,] You will leave *Me* all alone. Yet I am *not alone*, for My Father is with Me. I have told you these things, so that *in Me* you may have *peace*. [Cuz when you join the good guys] In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world. – John 16:32-33 NIV

And *our confidence* comes from witnessing *His conquest*. Jesus came into *enemy* territory *alone* and *outnumbered* as a *vulnerable baby* to show what kind of *courage* we should have once we've *made peace* with the *right* side. Cuz God *knows* how tempting the *world's* sinful propaganda *can be* – after all, who doesn't love "beaches, dancing, and parties galore!" – but, He proved the power of *His truth* prevails in even the most *humble* human so that each one of *us* can be completely *confident* that *our* surrender means victory. And by *personally* walking the path from *newly born* to *eternally* alive, Jesus proved *His* "surrender passes" had the power to ultimately lead *anyone* to the safety of the *winning* side. Because like Luke says, Jesus came here

To guide our feet into the path of peace [that He laid out for us to follow]. – Luke 1:79 NIV

[Cuz God wants peace – it's us who have to maintain our allegiance] You [God] will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast, because they trust in You. – Isaiah 26:3 NIV

Leaving the *losing* team *does* mean joining one who's *winning* – but **we have to** *fully* **defect** *before* **we** *can join* **Team Perfect**. No double-*minded*, double-*agents* who still want the *enemy's* approval! Cuz contrary to the *common* Christmas thought – God *doesn't* openly offer peace *on* earth *AND* goodwill toward men; that's a *mistranslation* that nearly every Bible has changed to something like:

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to those on whom His favor rests. - Luke 2:14 NIV

[And just to be *clear*, James lays it out] "God opposes the *proud* but <u>shows *favor* to the *humble*." [So] *Submit* yourselves, then, to God. – James 4:4, 6-7 NIV</u>

The Heavenly host are declaring peace *TO* – those who God's made peace *WITH* – because He "shows favor to the humble" who have *surrendered* themselves to His side. And,

Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God [not just peace from God] through our Lord Jesus Christ – Romans 5:1 NIV

So are you at peace? Have you completely committed to God's side by completely surrendering? If so, you should see this world as enemy territory – just like Jesus. And like Him, you shouldn't worry about what the world thinks because you know the approval of a losing side is a bad thing! We should be so loyal to truth that we can confidently conquer any worry of this world. Y'know, a few months ago, I stood in line behind an elderly man at a busy Rite Aid who was returning a pack of adult diapers. And as he loudly argued with the lady at the register, I thought to myself – this guy is my hero. Cuz he didn't give two shakes what the world thought – he was totally focused on what was right – and as he declared to the whole store, "These things aren't any more absorbent than a pair of jeans!" And even when the clerk calmly said, "But sir, you've used half of the bag..." he just replied, "Exactly! I wouldn't be burning through 'em if they were any good!" Wow! Now I don't know if his confidence came from his faith, but, either way, we should all aspire to be so free from earthly opinions, cuz it takes earthly humility to erase our heavenly hostility.

<u>Do not be anxious about anything</u>, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And <u>the peace of God</u>, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. – Philippians 4:6-7 NIV



"What if" worries only exist in this world and once we make peace with God, we can look past it all to see "what is" true. Which Henry Wadsworth Longfellow learned after his son was nearly paralyzed in the Civil War. Cuz the poet looked around at a divided and desperate country and struggled to understand how God had promised peace. Until the day, it clicked and he wrote the words that later became the carol "I Heard the Bells on Christmas Day."

And in despair I bowed my head;
"There is no peace on earth," I said;
"For hate is strong,
And mocks the song
Of peace on earth, good-will to men!"

Then pealed the bells more loud and deep: "God is not dead; nor doth he sleep!
The Wrong shall fail,
The Right prevail,
With peace on earth, good-will to men!

Cuz here's the bottom line: **God's got everything under control**. And if *you're* on *His* side, He's got you *too*. So, as the *Christmas chaos* comes, don't *settle* for *shallow wishes* of *peace on earth* – pursue the *real rest* of *peace with God*. Cuz Jesus came on Christmas to conquer our *hearts*, by telling us, "You don't have to fight Me anymore. *Surrender*, and I'll fight *for* you. And *we'll* win."

Father God, thank You for loving me in spite of my sin; forgive me and cleanse me by the sacrifice of Your Son, my Savior; and free me and lead me by Your Spirit and Word, as I seek to trust and follow Jesus Christ, as the Lord of my life. Amen.
