## Myrrh Maids

The Glory of the Tent Peg Story
December 22, 2024

Today we're asking the same ol' question that all kids ask:

What should we get our Father for Christmas? What do you get our Creator and Savior, after you've given Him your whole heart, and trusting-obedience, and dedication to growing in showing Christ-like kindness as His ambassador, and of course godly sorrow when you fall short? What more could He want? What can we, as His family, give to the Lord? He made a list.



Give to the Lord, O families ... Give to the Lord glory AND strength. [Strength is shorthand for: loving Him with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength, which includes loving our neighbor as our self. Give that to the Lord. Obviously. But, not so obviously] Give to the Lord the glory due His name; bring an offering, [of the glory] and come into His courts. [With praise!] — Psalm 96:7-8 NKJ



We're often directed to give God glory. But, how does He define the glory we're to give? He made a list. And it might surprise you. Because, I do not think that word means what you think it means. You see:



It is the <u>glory of God</u> to <u>conceal a matter;</u> [that's what He's given us; but] to search out a matter [that] is the glory of kings. – Proverbs 25:2 NIV



And [Revelation makes it clear that] [Jesus] has made us kings and priests to His God and Father, [so] to Him be [the] glory [of kings!] – Revelation 1:6 NKJ



[Because] The [hidden] glory of God [is what] gives [His holy City] light ... [for] the kings of the earth will bring their glory into it – Revelation 21:23-2 ESV

[Which is why Jesus said, that] "You are the light of the world. A city on a hill [that] cannot [and must not] be hidden." – Matthew 5:14 NIV

[Because, as He also said] "Those who speak on their own seek glory for themselves. [But] Those who seek the glory of [the Father] are people of truth" – John 7:18 CEB

So how do we give God glory? By seeking what He's hidden for us to find, in His Word. By asking. And knocking. And receiving. (Mt 7:7-11) And then bringing it to Him by treasuring it in our heart. (Mt 6:20-21) Where He lives. (Lk 17:21) It's like when you're young, and you go to the store, and your mom gives you \$5 to buy her a present. It's not about the gift, it's about the heart. The unseen part. The gift is just a means of communicating love. And in the same way:

[Faith is] [just] the [tangible] evidence of things [like love, that are otherwise] not seen. ...
[Which is why] He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him. – Hebrews 11:6 KJV

[So] "Search the Scriptures, for in them ... are those who testify of Me." – John 5:39 JUB

So, what say we do a little Christmas shopping! Starting with this hidden gem in Isaiah:




How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of Him who brings Good News, [of great joy! Otherwise known as the Gospel] who proclaims peace, who brings glad tidings of good things, who proclaims Salvation, [in Hebrew Yeshua/Jesus] [and] says ... "Your God reigns!" – Isaiah 52:7 NKJ



Every Christmas Shar and I hang an imprint of our first Grandson's feet as a decoration. Cuz what's cuter than tiny mistletoes? I made a mess of it when I tried something similar with his father! But what is it about the "beautiful" "feet" of "Him who brings the Gospel" of "Jesus" — which of course was Jesus. But, nine months before the manger:







Cuz it's a direct quote from the OT Song of Deborah, in Judges, which says:

Blessed among women be Jael, blessed among tent-dwelling women. [Why? Because, when Sisera, the enemy of God tried to hide under a rug in her tent] ... [Jael] reached for the [tent] peg [and] the workman's mallet. [And] She <u>hammered Sisera</u>, [and] <u>crushed</u> his head [with the spike, and] ... at her feet he sank and fell ... slain – Judges 5:24-27 NAB

And the writer of Psalm 83 uses Jael's head-crushing tent-peg action prophetically in regard to God's final blow against those who hate the Lord and consult together against Him, saying:

[O God] those who hate You have <u>lifted up their head</u>. They have taken crafty counsel ... and consulted together ... [So] <u>Deal with them</u> ... as with <u>Sisera</u> – Psalm 83:9 NKJ

And then the prophet Zechariah, takes the prophetic baton, when God adds on, that:

"The people wend their way like sheep ... in trouble because there is no [good] shepherd. [Therefore] My anger is kindled against [all] the shepherds ... For the Lord of hosts will visit His flock [Jesus said, "I am the Good Shepherd. [Because] The Good Shepherd gives His [own] life for the sheep." (Jn 10:11)] ... From Him comes the cornerstone, [a gem of glory you likely have; and] from Him the tent peg" [of Jael; a gem you likely don't] – Zechariah 10:2-4 NKJ

[And through Isaiah, adds] "I will fasten Him as a peg [when He hangs on the cross] ... [but] He will become a glorious throne to His Father's house. [In your heart. And] They will hang on Him all the [Father's hidden] glory" [about Him] – Isaiah 22:22-24 NKJ

Mary knew God's Word well enough to consider the hidden glory in Gabriel's greeting! "Rejoice! You've been chosen! God is with you! You're gonna be like ol' Jael the tent-spike head-crusher!"

[So] The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, [you're not the one crushing the head, but you are going to supply and hold the tent peg] for ... behold, you will conceive in your womb and bring forth a Son, and shall call His name Jesus. ... and the Lord God will give Him the throne of His father David. ... Then Mary said, [You] "Behold the maidservant of the Lord! Let it be to me according to your word." – Luke 1:30-38 NKJ



[Wherein] The Lord God said to the serpent, [from the beginning, this gem] ... "From now on, you and the woman will be enemies, and your [unholy] [seed] and her [holy] [Seed] will be enemies. [Until] He will [triumphantly] crush your head, and [at that same moment] you will [only pathetically manage to] strike His heel." – Genesis 3:14-15 NLT

Cuz the *peg* that *held* the *feet* of the *Seed* to the *cross,* was a *means* for our *tent peg* to *crush* our *enemy's head!* Paul is *clear* who the *Seed* is *here.* 

The promises [regarding the woman's holy Seed] were [also] spoken to Abraham and to his Seed. [Notice that] The Scripture does not say "and to seeds," meaning many people, but "and to your Seed," meaning one person, who is Christ. — Galatians 3:16 NIV

[Because, as Jesus said] "If a <u>seed</u> of <u>grain</u> [Oh, it's <u>grain</u>, eh?] is not <u>put</u> in the <u>ground</u> to die, it will be <u>only</u> a [lonely] seed. But if it dies, it will bear <u>many</u> seeds." – John 12:24 WEV

So, store up these gems: the Seed bore our sin as both lamb and grain offering. And we know His mom knew His glory, cuz she brilliantly weaves His story from Scripture when she greets her cousin.

[Beginning with] "My soul glorifies the Lord [with what I've found!] and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior [who comes as the spike to crush the enemy's head ... like Sisera! And] ... from now on [like Jael] all generations will call me blessed – Luke 1:46-48 NIV

[And ending with] "As He spoke to ... Abraham and to his Seed forever." – Luke 1:55 NKJ

And that line, "rejoices in God my Savior" is a quote from the prophet Habakkuk, who says:

You came out to save Your people [How?] ... You crushed the [head] [i.e. the leader] of the wicked ones ... [Therefore] I will rejoice in God my Savior. – Habakkuk 3:18 NCV

What all went through Mary's mind as Jesus grew into a toddler? How often did she kiss His toes and say, "These little feet are gonna crush that ol' serpents' head!" Having no concept of how our Father's first prophetic Word would be fulfilled when His Word would become flesh as both High Priest and Sacrifice. Now, fasten your seatbelts and fast-forward 33 years, to Martha and Mary's. Different Mary, but still a maidservant of the Lord. Maybe even a myrrh-maid-servant. Because:





Mary took a [securely sealed] alabaster flask of a pound of very costly oil of spikenard, [tent-spike-nard!] then she broke the flask [cuz it didn't have a lid; cuz it was sealed like something you'd find in an Egyptian tomb] and poured it on His head as He sat at the table, [and] anointed [His] feet ... and the house was filled with the fragrance – Mt 26:7; Mk 14:3; Jn 12:3 NKJ

And the *guests* and *disciples* were in *shock* because it was worth "more than 300 denarii"! (Mk 14:5) \$65,000! And they all go at Mary for wasting it on Jesus!

"Leave her alone," said Jesus. "She has done a beautiful thing to Me." ["How beautiful on the mountains are the feet of Him who brings the Gospel" (Is 52:7)] She did what [little] she could. She [just] poured perfume on My body beforehand. [But] It was intended [By whom?] that she should save this perfume to prepare Me [In what way?] for the day of My burial. [Not the burial itself] – Mt 26:10-12; Mk 14:6-8; Jn 12:7 NIV

And this is closest chance she'll get to do what must be done beforehand for Him. Because, Exodus (13:21) tells us the Lord led Israel out of Egypt and through the wilderness "in a column of smoke". And Jude (1:5) tells us that that was none other than "Jesus". And, get this, the Song of Solomon compares Jesus-in-the-smoke to a Bridegroom King, with this intriguing question:

Who is that coming up from the wilderness like a column of smoke, [and] perfumed with <u>myrrh</u> and <u>frankincense</u>, [along] with <u>all the fragrant powders</u>? – Song 3:6 NRS

God gave Moses two secret formulas: (1) A sacred myrrh mixture, used to anoint the heads of the priests. (Ex 30:23-30) And (2) a holy frankincense blend, used as a pleasing fragrance with the combined Lamb and grain offering. (Lev 2:1; Ex 29:41) And, when the people had sinned against God:

Aaron [the priest] offered the [frank]incense to remove their sin. – Numbers 16:47 NCV

But, the *Myrrh mixture* and the *Frankincense blend* were never combined. Except once. Prophetically. And it was called ... spikenard. Found only in the story of Mary anointing Jesus' head and feet as He sat at the table, and in the Song of Songs, when the bride says:



13 Pleasing is the fragrance of your perfumes ... poured out. [As one, by her] No wonder the maidens love you! [The myrrh-maidens; because] ... 1:12 While the king is at his table, my spikenard sends forth its fragrance. [But alas, in the song, the Bridegroom King must go his way] 4:6 ... to the mountain of myrrh [as high priest] and to the hill of frankincense. [As that lamb and grain offering. But then she smells like him, and he says] 4:7 ... there is no spot in you. [Like with Jesus and His glorious bride, the church; (Eph 5:27) because] 4:14 ... Spikenard [is made with all] frankincense [and] Myrrh – Song 1:3, 4:6-14 NKJ

Now, 500 years before Jesus' birth:

Daniel [was placed] in charge of all [the] wise men. [Of the east] – Daniel 2:48 NIV

And in the angel Gabriel's only other named appearance, he tells Daniel when and where Christ will come and will be anointed; and tells him to seal it up; (Dan 9:21-25) and says that Daniel will shine like a star when he leads others to righteousness. (Dan 12:24) And Daniel's royal name, by the way, was Belteshazzar, which means: One who lays up treasures in secret. So, when:

They gave [Jesus] treasures of gold, [and] frankincense and myrrh. – Matthew 2:11 NCV

I think it's two gifts: gold and a \$65,000 sealed jar of spikenard, with a note that said, "Don't open until"! Cuz Daniel's the only one who could've sent it, and intended it for the day of Jesus' death. And Jesus trusted Mary to save it, to prepare Him, to save those who trust Him. By nailing Satan like ol' Sisera and crushing the head of sin and death as both High Priest (Heb 4:14) and Sacrifice! (1 Pet 1:18-19)

[So, what can we Jr. kings of glory say, but] Glory to God in the highest! – Luke 2:14 NIV

[Because] Eternal life [goes] to those who ... seek for glory – Romans 2:5-8 NKJ

[So] Let my mouth be filled with Your praise and with Your glory – Psalm 71:8 NKJ

And let the whole earth be filled with His glory. Amen and Amen. – Psalm 72:19 NKJ

Father God, thank You for loving me in spite of my sin; forgive me and cleanse me by the sacrifice of Your Son, my Savior; and free me and lead me by Your Spirit and Word, as I seek to trust and follow Jesus Christ, as the Lord of my life. Amen.
