Look Who's Talking

Resolving Relentless Restlessness

Today we're learning to find rest in *God's Word* **by confirming it's** *Him we heard.* Cuz, in a world full of *pep-talk preachers* and *feel-good churches*, God's message can get *watered down* or *dressed up* so *we'll* hear what we *want* to hear – even if it means *manipulating* the message. So, the *convicting* question of the day is this: **Are you sure your faith is in the right place?**



Well, we better be sure cuz this *might be* the most *important* question in our *lives!* Cuz the *beliefs* we *build* are only as good as the *foundation* we *trust* and therefore *misplaced faith* leads to *total failure*.



You ever *misplace faith* in a *contractor* to build something in your house? I have, and I think everyone who has can agree that *communication breakdown* is what led to the *construction meltdown!* Cuz if you're not on the same page, a simple addition can become a painful money pit! That's how I had someone rebuild a wall that I never wanted to be torn down and why two of my living room outlets don't work after someone else cut a cord without checking what was in our wall! So, it just made sense when Jesus stressed the idea of staying on the same page when it comes to building our faith, when He said:



Everyone who <u>hears these words of *Mine*</u> and puts <u>them</u> into practice is like a wise man who built *his* house on the rock. – Matthew 7:24 NIV



Cuz, as Bruce brought up *yesterweek*, it's God's trustworthy words that comfort, encourage, and talk us off the ledge when we're on edge!

[So, like Ezekiel, we're repeatedly reminded to:] Receive into your heart all My words that I speak to you, and hear with your ears. – Ezekiel 3:10 NKJ

But you ever wonder, what's with God's ongoing emphasis on who's who when it comes to our conversations? I mean, isn't it kinda easy to see who's speaking? And don't we kinda have to hear with our ears? Why is He so worried about miscommunication? Well, in a nutshell, it kinda killed all humans and got us kicked out of His presence in paradise. Remember?

Back in the beginning, we had it made in the shade; chilling out, maxin', relaxin' all cool cuz:

<u>The LORD God</u> had planted a garden in the east, in Eden; and there He put the man *He* had formed. [And] <u>The LORD God</u> made all kinds of trees grow out of the ground—trees that were pleasing to the eye and good for food [to feed us *humans*]. — Genesis 2:8-9 NIV

That was God's *original recipe* for the good life: **He** *provides*, and we *partake*. We were at rest and the *only* effort *we* had to *make* was following *His orders* to make sure we'd *avoid* the *poison*.

[Cuz all He said was:] You are *free* to eat from *any tree* in the garden; *but* <u>you must *not* eat</u> from the [single] tree of the knowledge of good and evil, for when you eat from *it* you will certainly *die*. – Genesis 2:16-17 NIV

And who can't remember one, easy-to-follow, life-saving rule? How could things go wrong?











[Well,] The serpent said to the woman, "Did God really say, 'You must not eat from any tree in the garden'?" [to which Eve must've thought, "No. Nobody ever said that's what He said... why would you even think that?" So,] The woman said to [correct] the serpent, "We may eat fruit from the trees in the garden, but God did say, 'You must not eat fruit from the [single] tree that is in the middle of the garden, and you must not touch it, or you will die."" — Genesis 3:1-3 NIV

Wait, He did?! Maybe it's not recorded, but from the story we just heard in God's Word, Eve seems to be misquoting the command! And from here, the serpent easily corrupts the rest of the conversation until Eve completely abandons God's simple command! How did that happen?

Well, as the kids say, "She got played." But as the scientists say, "She fell victim to the psychological phenomenon called the misinformation effect!" Because when someone presents new information that conflicts with old memories, it can retroactively interfere with our ability to retain what we remember. It's kinda like brainwashing. And get this, it's been shown that individuals can be made susceptible to incorporating misleading information into their memory when it's presented within a question! Lawyers use this to their advantage all the time by using leading questions like, "Did you see the broken headlight?" rather than, "Did you see a broken headlight?" Cuz subtly introducing a false fact leads us to reconstruct what we remember so it can fit.

So, just by asking if God said something He didn't, the serpent began corrupting the whole conversation – and that opened the door to a new narrative he could help create. It's like the movie Inception. Cuz in that sci-fi classic, Leonardo DiCaprio travels into someone's subconscious and plants an idea by subtly tweaking a memory in an effort to control the person's behavior. As he explains, "The seed we planted in this man's mind may come to define him."

So all the *serpent* had to *do*, was plant a seed of *doubt* about who's *talking* we should *trust* and sure enough, *doubt came to define us* as it *led* us to *focus on the fraud* instead of listening to *God*. And since losing our *attention* meant losing His *presence*, we *also* lost what He *provided*, and what seemed like *simple miscommunication* ultimately meant *losing* the *rest* we *had* in our best life. Cuz

"Cursed is the ground because of you [letting the dummy speak for God! Now], through painful toil you will eat food from it all the days of your life. It will produce thorns and thistles for you ... [So,] By the sweat of your brow you will eat your food — Genesis 3:16-19 NIV

Mishear His words and no more "Lord God" doing the heavy lifting! Cuz we can't cooperate if our communication is corrupted! Cuz without His real words, we get lost real quick!

In fact, everything falls apart when unnecessary steps are added; especially when a third-party is added to a one-on-one discussion. You ever play the game telephone? It's fun cuz we can count on communication breaking down with each layer that's added — because, the more indirect our communication, the more intense our contamination! Add a few steps and a simple sentence like "The cat is asleep in the laundry basket" twists into "The bat is a creep who's fond of caskets."









But the phenomenon is only fun when we anticipate the effect, otherwise, relying on others to relay our words leads to worry. Which you already know thanks to high school. Cuz it's built on important information being shared through indirect communication. And how did that go for you? Did you feel that you were accurately represented when you were out of the room? Probably not!

Cuz the only way to assure our words aren't being twisted is to speak for ourselves. And that requires constant contact, cuz if high school taught us anything it's that drama develops from talking about people instead of talking to people! And the same goes for God! Cuz most of our problems stem from talking about God when we should be talking to God. Eve should've gone to God before trusting the serpent and we should turn to His Word before trusting anyone else's input!

[Like Paul told Timothy,] Guard what has been entrusted to your care. Turn away from godless chatter and the opposing ideas of what is falsely called knowledge, which some have professed and in so doing have departed from the faith. [Cuz,] – 1 Timothy 6:20-21 NIV

If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask *God* [No serpent, sermon, or other go-between. Go to the Source]... But when you ask, you must believe and not doubt – James 1:5-6 NIV

Because the input of *others* may *corrupt* communication, but *how* we hear is just as important as *who* we hear. Y'see, there's *two* sides to *every* conversation and once we get the *speaker* straight, we need to learn to *hear* with *our ears* cuz sometimes our own *heart* steps in to twist the truth. And letting *our* own *desires* manipulate *God's* words is just as *deadly* as the *serpent's subconscious sabotage!* Even the *disciples* had to deal with *that* danger! Remember *this* story:

When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi, He asked His disciples, "Who do people say the Son of Man is?" They replied, "Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, Jeremiah or one of the prophets." – Matthew 16:13-14 NIV

Good! They're aware of the outside influence we need to see to guard God's words. But now, to see if the truth has been tainted by their own hearts Jesus asks the million-dollar question:

"But what about you?" He asked. "Who do you say I am?" Simon Peter answered, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God." Jesus replied, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah, for this was not revealed to you by flesh and blood, but by My Father in heaven. And I tell you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church [Good job Charlie – you get the chocolate factory! I know ol' Slugworth was trying to twist my words but your trust in who I am wasn't corrupted! So maybe it's time for this:] – Matthew 16:15-19 NIV







[And] Jesus began to explain to His disciples that He must ... suffer many things ... [and] be killed and on the third day be raised to life. [But,] Peter took Him aside and began to *rebuke* Him. "Never, Lord!" he said. "This shall never happen to You!" [Correcting Jesus... bold move Pete.] Jesus turned and said to Peter, "Get behind Me, Satan! You are a stumbling block to Me; you do not have in mind the concerns of God [anymore], but merely human concerns," — Matthew 16:21-23 NIV

Peter, Peter, Peter. So *close* and yet so *far*. *Two verses* earlier he was a *hero* cuz he heard God's words in spite of all the interference – but when *his* heart *refused* to hear what it didn't *want* to hear, all of the *sudden*, he's *back* on the side of the *serpent* as *Satan* himself!

[Cuz] The heart is deceitful above all things – Jeremiah 17:9 NIV

But whether it's caused by *others* or *ourselves*, *twisting* God's Word means *war* cuz only *trusting* God's Word means *rest!* And since Jesus *knows* how *deadly* this *simple* mistake can *be*, you can hear it get Him *fired up* cuz He really rips *into people* whenever it *comes up!* Ask the *Pharisees!*

[Jesus told 'em] "Isaiah was right when he prophesied about *you* hypocrites; as it is written: "These people honor Me with their *lips*, but their hearts are far from Me. They worship Me in vain; their teachings are merely human rules.' You have let go of the commands of God and are holding on to human traditions." ... "You have a fine way of setting aside the commands of God in order to observe your own traditions! ... Thus you nullify the Word of God by your tradition ... And you do many things like that." – Mark 7:6-9, 13 NIV

Regardless of what our human heart wants to hear, we've gotta let God's Word have the final word.

[Like the *Bereans!* Cuz] The Berean Jews were of *more noble character* than those in Thessalonica, for they received the message with great eagerness *and* [to check their heart] examined the *Scriptures* every day to *see* if what Paul said *was true*. – Acts 17:11 NIV

And I wish this was at the top of every Sunday service, because I want us to be crystal clear – *churches* shouldn't speak *for* God, they should urge *you* to speak *with* God! And that means pointing you to prayer and Scripture. Cuz to be sure our faith is in the right place, we have to be sure we're hearing the right words. So when His message got misheard, thank goodness God put it in writing! Literally! We got duped, so He wrote us a book to keep us on the same page so we'd always know where to go to confirm we're in communication with Him and not some other dummy or our own wicked heart. So how often do you turn to God's Word to hear His real heart? Not enough if you're not at rest!



[Cuz Jesus said] Come to Me ... and I will give you rest. [but coming to Him means reading His Word cuz as He explains:] — Matthew 11:28 NIV

These *are* the very Scriptures that testify about *Me*, yet you *refuse* to come to Me to have life. – John 5:39-40 NIV

So if you're feeling unrested, here's your assignment: unplug from others, quiet your heart, and get in God's Word to get your relationship back on the same page, so He can provide and you can partake!

Father God, thank You for loving me in spite of my sin; forgive me and cleanse me by the sacrifice of Your Son, my Savior; and free me and lead me by Your Spirit and Word, as I seek to trust and follow Jesus Christ, as the Lord of my life. Amen.
