## Dressed to Dazzle



Defeating Death With Linen of Light February 9, 2025

Today we're talking about how to dress to defeat death!

So, what are you planning to wear when you die? I don't mean what you leave behind, down here. I mean when you get home, up there. Because, in John's vision of Jesus' Revelation, he saw:

The armies of heaven ... dressed in fine linen, white and clean. – Revelation 19:14 NIV



[Which is why] The Ruler of God's creation ... [warns, that] "You do not realize that you are ... naked. [And] I counsel you to buy from Me ... white clothes to wear" – Revelation 3:14-18 NIV



[Because] It was given to [the bride of the Lamb] [the body of Christ] to <u>clothe</u> <u>herself</u> in <u>fine linen</u>, bright and <u>clean</u>; for the <u>fine linen</u> is the <u>righteous acts</u> of the <u>saints</u>. [Oh, it's <u>symbolic</u>] – Revelation 19:8 NAS



There're only a few things that make it beyond the grave: truth, love, God's children, scars, and acts of compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, patience, and forgiveness. Jesus often called death: sleeping; and in Revelation, He says:



"Blessed is the *one* who stays awake and is clothed, not going about naked and exposed to shame." – Revelation 16:15 NRS



I grew up in this building when it was a wrecking yard. I look in the back, and I can still see the parts. And I look up front, and I can still see the men who worked here. And a week ago Friday, Joe Lukens' ashes were right up here. And I have no doubt that Joe is richly dressed! But when I was a teenager, Joe rebuilt transmissions, right here! And I can't imagine what Joe would've thought had he been told that one day his memorial would be held in that very spot! Cuz we just can't imagine what our Father has in store! Like Solomon who laments:



No one has *power* over the *spirit* to *retain* the *spirit*, and <u>no one has *power* in the day of *death*. There is no *release* from *that war* – Ecclesiastes 8:8 NKJ</u>



[But, contemplating this, Ethan asks the Lord] Have you created Adam's descendants for no reason? [If not] Can a mortal go on living and never [even] see death? [If so] Who can set himself <u>free</u> from the <u>power</u> of the <u>grave</u>? [Three guesses!] – Psalm 89:47-48 GWT

He was *crucified* in *weakness*, yet <u>He lives by God's power</u>. Likewise, we are weak [even] in Him, yet by God's power <u>we will live with Him to serve you</u>. – 2 Corinthians 13:4 NIV

Now, why would Paul end with: to serve you? To remind us that eternal life begins here and now. So don't wait till you die to start walking toward the light, with the Light of Life at your side.

For You <u>have delivered</u> me from <u>death</u> [past tense] ... that I <u>may walk</u> before God [present tense] in the <u>light</u> of <u>life</u>. – Psalm 56:13 NIV

[Therefore] If we say that we have fellowship with Him, and walk in darkness, we lie to ourselves] and do not practice the truth. But if we walk in the light as He is in the light ... the blood of Jesus Christ His Son cleanses us from all sin. – 1 John 1:6-7 NKJ

[But] Those who trust in their wealth ... none of them can by any [worldly] means redeem his brother, nor give to God a ransom for him— for the redemption of their souls is costly, and [worldly wealth] shall cease forever— [so "what man can live and not see death" and "redeem his brother" and "deliver his life from the power of the grave" by "giving God a ransom for him"] that he should CONTINUE to live eternally, [at the point of death] and not see the pit. ["For they have all been delivered to death ... who go down to the Pit." (Ezek 31:14)] ... but God will redeem my soul from the power of the grave, for He [not death] shall receive me. — Psalm 49:6-15 NKJ

I'm not afraid of flying; I had a pilot's license, but I am afraid of taking off. As the plane lifts off and climbs steeply, I always pray the same simple prayer: "Catch me." And, it calms me and comforts me by reminding me He's ready to receive me.

Because, eternal life doesn't begin when He receives us, but the moment we receive Him. And so:

When calamity comes ... even in death the righteous have a refuge. – Proverbs 14:32 NIV

[As Jesus said] "If anyone keeps My Word, he will never see death." - John 8:51 NIV

A year before the cross, Jesus calls the crowd to come to Him to receive rest for their weary souls.

That by *His death* He might *destroy* [the devil] who *holds* the *power* of *death* ... and *free* those who *all* their *lives* were *held* in *slavery* by their *fear* of *death*. — Hebrews 2:14-15 NIV









[And] An expert in the law stood up to test Jesus. "Teacher," he asked, "what must I do to inherit eternal life?" "What is written in the Law?" [Jesus] replied. ["You're the expert; you tell Me"] ... He answered: "'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind'; [which is between you and God] and, 'Love your neighbor as yourself." [Which is between you and everyone who knows you] "You have answered correctly," Jesus replied. [So take your own advice] "Do this and you will live." But [he didn't want to do this; and with the tables suddenly turned] he wanted to justify himself, [To whom? To himself and those who knew him] so he asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" – Luke 10:25-29 NIV

This guy is lookin' for loopholes. Because, under the law, we just can't love 'em enough to earn it. Whereas, under grace, we just gratefully do what we can to live in love. We had a windstorm a while back on garbage day. And my empty can was rolling in the road; so I secured it; and secured my neighbor's, across the street. And then noticed, in both directions, so many cans! And I stood there, like ol' Loophole there, pondering how many houses were technically neighbors. And how many cans!'d have to secure to love 'em as myself.

In reply Jesus said: "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, when he fell into the hands of robbers. They stripped him of his clothes, beat him and went away, leaving him half dead. ... When [a priest] saw the man, he passed by on the other side. [Cuz if he got within six feet - or even let his shadow fall on a corpse - it would defile his religious purity and he'd have to undergo an inconvenient cleansing process So too, a Levite, [a priest's assistant, who both wore white linen (Ex 28:39-40; Ezek 44:17-18) as a symbol of holiness] ... But [here's where everyone expects Jesus to say, an ordinary Jew; cuz that's how parables went: a priest, a Levite, and a regular guy; but Jesus catches 'em all off guard, saying] a Samaritan, [a despised, intermixed, Jewish-pagan whose people ran a rival temple – like saying, "a Christian-hating, church-desecrating, militant cult member as he traveled, came where the man was; and ... <u>took pity on him</u>. He went to him and <mark>[took some *olive oil* and some *wine*</mark> that he happened to have, and] bandaged his wounds, pouring on oil and wine. [And, by doing what he could, dressing his wounds with what he had, he dressed himself in that linen of light] Then he put the man on his own donkey, [cuz he chose to get off his donkey and walk ... in the *light;* and took him to an *inn* and took *care* of *him*. ... [Now] Which of these *three* do you think was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?" The expert in the law [who can't even bring himself to say the word: Samaritan] replied, "The one who had mercy on him." Jesus told him, [so] "Go and do likewise." – Luke 10:30-37 NIV



Sections of the road that Jesus refers to still exist. And in the story, we can see three paths we can choose to walk. 1) The robbers who take and leave for dead. And, 2) The religious who keep and leave for dead. And, 3) The righteous who give and lead to life. So which of the three do you live by? Trick question. Cuz we can only live by walking in the light of love. Because:

Anyone who does not *love REMAINS* in *death*. – 1 John 3:14b NIV



Why does Jesus say the *robbers left* the *victim* "half dead"? Was Jesus a *pessimist?* It isn't a *known expression*. Jesus just *joins* those *two words*. And it's *only* used *here*, until *centuries* later. And I *find* it *fascinating* because He says, "they *stripped* him of his *clothes*". And, as Jesus *knows*:

Death is naked before God [which makes a living, naked victim half dead] – Job 26:6 NIV

[Whereas] "The one who is *victorious* will ... be <u>dressed</u> in <u>white</u>. [And, says Jesus] I will never blot out the name of that person from the Book of Life" – Revelation 3:5 NIV

[And in Revelation, John saw] A great multitude ... standing before the throne and in front of the Lamb ... wearing white robes ... [Because] These in white robes ... have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. — Revelation 7:9-14 NIV

[And] "They will walk with Me, dressed in white, for they are worthy." – Revelation 3:4 NIV

[Remember when] Jesus took *Peter*, *James* and *John* with *Him* and ... was transfigured before them. [And] *His clothes* became dazzling white, whiter than anyone in the world could bleach them. [Because they represent His righteous acts!] – Mark 9:2-3 NIV

[And, as] [Jesus had] said, "I am the Light of the world. [So] Whoever follows Me will never [willingly] walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." – John 8:12 NIV

[Because] In Him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. [And] The light of life] shines in the darkness of death, and the darkness has not overcome it. – John 1:4-5 NIV

[Because we don't fear death, for] We know that we have <u>left</u> our old dead way of <u>life</u>. And we have <u>entered into new life</u>. [Walking home with the <u>Light</u> of <u>Life</u>. Know how we know this?] We know this because we love one another. – 1 John 3:14a NIR

[It's that simple] Anyone who does not love remains in death. – 1 John 3:14b NIV

[And] We belong to Christ Jesus, [so] we have killed our selfish feelings and desires. [Cuz] God's Spirit has given us life, and so we should follow the Spirit. – Galatians 5:24-25 CEV

For if you *live* according to the *flesh*, [the *sinful nature*] you will *die*; but if *by* the *Spirit* <u>you</u> <u>put to *death* the *misdeeds* of the body, you will *live* [even *though* you *die* (In 11:25)]. For those who are *led* by the Spirit of *God* are the *children* of God. – Romans 8:13-14 NIV</u>

So kill your earthly impulses – Colossians 3:5 VOICE

[But you gotta be dressed to kill, so] <u>Clothe yourselves</u> with the Lord Jesus Christ, and do not [even] think about how to gratify the desires of the sinful nature. – Romans 13:14 NIV

[But] Clothe yourselves with <u>compassion</u>, <u>kindness</u>, <u>humility</u>, <u>gentleness</u> and <u>patience</u>. ... <u>Forgive</u> as the Lord forgave <u>you</u>. And <u>over all</u> ... put on <u>love</u> ... [and] Let the <u>peace</u> of Christ <u>rule</u> in your <u>hearts</u> ... and be <u>thankful</u>. – Colossians 3:12-15 NIV

For [As Wisdom herself says] whoever finds me finds life and receives favor from the Lord. But ... all who hate me [apparently] love death." – Proverbs 8:35-36 NIV

[And, like Jesus said] "Wisdom is proved right by all her children." – Luke 7:35 NIV

[Because] "Wisdom is proved right by her actions." – Matthew 11:19 NIV

So: Why did the Priest and the Levite cross the road? To sidestep an inconvenience. And, in a remarkably religiously twisted way: to supposedly honor God by avoiding a sinner. So let this serve as a warning. Because, our mind will always find a way to justify our heart's desire. But in the end, it'll all be exposed. Are you wondering what I did with all my neighbor's garbage cans? I just threw mine back in the road! No. I did what I could with the time I had; and I left the rest, guilt free. So, who might God be calling you to show mercy to? Because, in all probability, like with that lawyer looking for a loophole, it'll likely be exactly who you're hoping it's not. What with the whole "love your enemies" and "bless those who curse you" (Mt 5:44) and all that. But, how do you decide who to help and when? How should I know?! Sometimes, we can help to their hurt — it's called enabling. And sometimes, we can hurt to their help — it's called tough love. Because it's situational and relational and subjective and messy. And God allows it to be, because, He opts for messy relationships over tidy religious robotics. But then, it's not rocket science.

"In everything, [just] do to others what you would have them do to you, [and you'll be good] for this sums up the Law and the Prophets." – Matthew 7:12 NIV

I think Jesus' point is to just **stop looking for loopholes**. And **look to Him for inspiration and motivation**. And walk in the light on the only path that leads beyond the grave. And watch for true needs along your way. And if you can help, just get off your donkey and do what you can.

Father God, thank You for loving me in spite of my sin; forgive me and cleanse me by the sacrifice of Your Son, my Savior; and free me and lead me by Your Spirit and Word, as I seek to trust and follow Jesus Christ, as the Lord of my life. Amen.
