To Serve and Perfect



What We Get From Giving
March 9, 2025

Today we're learning why we should want to serve others! Cuz one of the clearest *commands* we have as *Christians* is serving *others* – but one of the deepest *desires* we have as *humans* is serving *ourselves*. And until we have a good enough *reason* to tip the scales in favor of *others*, we've got some *work* to do. So, let's *start* with an honest *assessment*: do you prefer to serve or be served?









Really think about it, cuz self-serving is sneaky! And even our most selfless moments can get tainted by selfish thoughts. For example, generally, I pray my longest prayer of the day while driving cuz I'm able to speak casually out loud with God about what I got going on; everything from people and projects to health and hobbies. But – three times this year, I caught my self-serving heart trying to sneak into my prayers. Cuz three times now, instead of addressing my prayer to God, I've accidentally started by saying "Alexa." Uh-oh... I just started my conversation with the *Creator* of the *universe* like I was about to set a reminder, make a shopping list, or google a question! At least I haven't made the opposite mistake... yet! Cuz according to Sigmund Freud, the founder of psychoanalysis, this kind of 'slip' occurs when our unconscious thoughts bubble up to the surface and influence conscious behaviors. Which makes sense, cuz I know what I was about to pray for - and subconsciously, I was treating God as my digital assistant rather than spiritual superior. Because it's easy to see a server as inferior. And yet, helpers are anything but helpless! In fact, a server's whole role is to provide what we can't or won't.

Think about public servants like teachers, *firefighters*, and *social workers* – they're *not* beneath us, *they* actually possess *superior* skills that *we* need. Cuz regardless of whether we're *incapable* or *unwilling*, what really *defines* our servers is that *servers* step in where *we* fall short.

[And because we all fall short, Jesus stepped in:] For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many. – Mark 10:43-45 NIV

[But, He also said:] I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you ... Now that you know these things, you will be blessed if you do them. – John 13:12-17 NIV

Do not merely listen to the Word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says. – James 1:22 NIV

Contrary to what *some* Christians *think*, **Jesus didn't** *serve* **to let us** *off the hook*, **but to put us** *on the spot*. We're supposed to see *His* example of *serving* as our *call* to *follow* – because somehow, *serving* is supposed to *help us* overpower *death* and live a life beyond *this world* – the way Jesus' humble *love* made Him the *first* to ever conquer the *grave*:

I have told you these things, so that in Me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world. – John 16:33 NIV

Cuz remember, Jesus is not saying, "Don't worry; I've conquered it for you," He's saying, "I've overcome the world," as in, "Don't worry; you can too!" Which is why John later says:



Who is it that overcomes the world? Only the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God. – 1 John 5:5 NIV



Cuz when we *believe* that only Jesus *knew* what we have to *do* to *escape death* – *His* example becomes *our plan!* And as He said *Himself*, He came to *serve*. So, the question is, **how is** *serving* the secret to our *salvation*? Well, *serving* is both *sanctifying* and *satisfying*.



Y'see, sanctification is just transformation — it's the process of replacing our sinful lives with holy ones — and every act of Jesus-like serving eliminates an opportunity for life-threatening sin. Basically, if we're busy doing the good God wants, we won't have time to give in to sin. Ever hear the saying "Idle hands are the devil's workshop" — well, it's biblical:



[Paul says] Do not give the devil a foothold. Anyone who has been stealing must steal no longer, but must work, doing something useful with their own hands, that they may have something to share with those in need. Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up according to their needs, that it may benefit those who listen. – Ephesians 4:27-29 NIV



By putting our focus on *helping others*, **serving stops sin before** it **starts**. Cuz it keeps our focus *off* the *self-serving sin* of *this world's* ways.

[The way Jesus says] Whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for Me will find it. What good will it be for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul? Or what can anyone give in exchange for their soul? — Matthew 16:25-26 NIV

And that's not a rhetorical question! He just answered it – give your worldly life to Jesus and you get eternal life for your soul. And we know that giving our life for someone else is the ultimate act of serving, cuz after saying He came to serve, Jesus added "to give His life as ransom for many."

Therefore, [says Paul,] I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship. Do not conform to the pattern of this [self-serving] world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind [as you give your life over to Jesus' service]. — Romans 12:1-2 NIV

Cuz in the end, *every life* has the *same choice: conform* or *transform*. We can follow the way of *this world* which *inevitably* leads to *death* or we can point ourselves in the *opposite* direction which *logically* leads to *life*. Cuz when we choose to *oppose* this self-*serving world* – by modeling our *lives* after a self-*sacrificing* Jesus – we start to *transform* our *identity* as we *discover* our *purpose*. Which Paul *explains* and John says how to *attain*:

You were taught, with regard to your former way of life, to *put off your old self*, which is being corrupted by its deceitful desires; to be made new *in the attitude of your minds*; and to <u>put on the new self</u>, created to be like God in true righteousness and holiness. – Ephesians 4:22-24 NIV

[Cuz] He who practices righteousness is righteous, just as [Jesus] is righteous. – 1 John 3:7 NKJ











We were *created* to *be* like *God* in true *righteousness* – which takes *practicing* righteousness – which takes *serving others*. Cuz **keeping our actions out of evil's reach keeps them under God's influence.** And every day we serve *others* over *ourselves*, we discover *more* godly *truths* that *inspire* and *encourage* our ongoing *transformation* because **serving satisfies the deeper goals of our souls**. In fact, once we *reject* the *underwhelming* offerings of *this world*, each higher *desire* that we *develop* is revealed to be *in reach* of our *true self*. Cuz following Jesus teaches **serving is a sign of** *strength*, **serving helps us find and flex** *our* **strength, and serving** *connects* **and** *completes* **us!**

Ultimately, serving guides us to uncover our true identity as a powerful instrument of God to *edify*, *unify*, and *sanctify* all His children – just as Jesus did. Which is both an *honor* and a *necessity*. Because **there's a few things God can't do without a servant's help.** And this includes His #1 priority; **He can't change our heart!** He keeps that task out of His hands because we can't have true love without free will. So **when we step up to serve others, we're really helping Him to humble our heart** so we can develop the love that has the power to hold us together once we're reunited. So, keep that in mind when the serving gets tough – and:

Serve wholeheartedly, <u>as if you were serving the Lord</u>, not people – Ephesians 6:7 NIV

Because the best part is, serving Him means saving us! That's His big goal — and as much as we'd like to believe in our ability — we didn't know how to serve Him until He sent Jesus to serve us. Proving no matter what, we can't out-give God! The best we can do is try to follow His example.

So, do you prefer to serve or be served? Well, you won't know until you try! But God promises it's serving others by a million miles! Cuz when serving sanctifies our actions it transforms our life. And we can begin to see our true identity. And when serving reveals our identity, it satisfies our soul! Because finding our fit is the very definition of fulfillment!

And that's what *church* is all about – *finding your fit to serve your part* in *the body of Christ* – so every soul with a higher desire can be *sanctified* and *satisfied!* And to help you out, we have a *special treat* for you today – all of our ministries *here* at His Place have set up *booths* for you to *peruse* with all the opportunities we have to serve each other and the Lord!
