Serving a Purpose



Exercising Your Set of Skills
March 16, 2025

Today we're learning how we're supposed to serve, specifically. Cuz, as we saw last week – serving each other isn't an option we choose, it's a command we follow! And that's because serving others actually humbles our heart and reveals our identity – which allows God to sanctify and satisfy us. And as we grow into who we were created to be, we also transform the misguided misery of a helpless human into the fulfilling faith of a soul made whole! But, to assume our identity, we have to make sure we're playing our part the way it was written, so: **Are you serving your purpose?**



Cuz once we understand why serving is our common command – all we need to feel fulfilled is our specific assignment.



For we are God's handiwork, <u>created</u> in <u>Christ Jesus to do good works</u>, which God <u>prepared in advance</u> for us to do. – Ephesians 2:10 NIV



And since God prepared *specific tasks* for *each* of us so we could make our *unique contributions*, *we feel complete* when we *fulfil His will*. Ever see the movie *Chariots of Fire?* It's the true story of Eric Liddell, a devout *Christian* and Olympic *sprinter* who miraculously *won* a gold medal for Britain and in the film he famously said "I believe God made me for a purpose, but He *also* made me *fast*. And when I *run*, I feel His pleasure." Cuz whether it's *cooking* a *meal*, *writing* a *song*, or *doing taxes* – there's a *million* moments where *our abilities* are perfectly *suited* to meet *someone else's need;* and finding *that* fit *simultaneously* strengthens our *identity* and our *community*. Which is why *God's* goal is for everyone to find their *individual fit* in the *collective community* of Christ:



For we were all baptized by one Spirit so as to form *one body* ... [But] the body is *not* made up of *one part* but of *many*. ... [And] God has placed the parts in the body, every one of them, just as He wanted them to be ... If one part *suffers*, every part suffers with it; if one part is *honored*, every part rejoices with it. Now *you are* the body of Christ, and each one of you is a *part* of it. – 1 Corinthians 12:13-14, 18, 26-27 NIV



We become *like Christ* when we become a *part* of Him. And we become a part of Christ when we take *our place* in *His plan*. And we *discover* our place when we start *using* our specific skills to serve the *rest* of His *body*. Because our natural-born *talents* are pre-planned *clues* that lead to our God-given *purpose*. And once we *accept* the role that God *specifically* prepared *us* to play, the constant *confusion* of *this* life is *replaced* with the perpetual *power* of a life lived with *purpose!*

And since serving is central to the body of Christ, we can assess our fit by the quality of our service. Because, if playing our part means serving God's purpose – our serving should have the same confidence, faith, humility, gratitude, excitement, joy, and love that defined Jesus' service.

So, are you serving with confidence? If you've found your purpose, you shouldn't be worried that you're in the wrong place. Because you should feel the full power of your abilities.





Kinda like Liam Neeson in the movie *Taken*. Cuz when the bad guys kidnap his daughter he calmly tells them, "I don't have money, but what I do have are a very particular set of skills ... Skills that make me a nightmare for people like you ... and I will look for you, I will find you and I will kill you." *Chilling isn't it?!* That's the *kind* of *confidence* we should have when we're serving *our* purpose! Cuz once we *trust* that *our uniqueness* was designed to serve *God's specific purpose*, we can say, "I don't have all the *answers*, but what I do have are a very particular set of skills, skills that make me a *blessing* to certain people, so I will look for them, I will find them, and I will help them."

[Like Peter says:] Each of you should <u>use whatever gift you have received to serve others</u>, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms. – 1 Peter 4:10 NIV

Y'see, *confidence* grows as *our actions align* with *God's design*, cuz we get to see our efforts bear the biggest *fruit* when we play the *part* we were *born* to play! And *that* should build our *faith!*



So, are you serving with faith? If you're serving the purpose of your placement, nothing should shake your confidence. Because you should trust God's plan over your feelings. Remember, you're just a part of the body and your skills are meant for a specific purpose, but Jesus is the Head so we must believe only He sees where the body needs to be! Like Paul:

If I were still trying to please people, I would not be a servant of Christ. – Galatians 1:10 NIV

Serving with faith means God's role is our goal because we know our purpose only reaches its full potential when it's under His control. And that faith is how we temper our confidence with humility.



So, are you serving with humility? If you're fulfilling your specific assignment to serve, your unique gifts should be accomplishing things you thought were out of your reach. Cuz you should recognize God amplifies your impact beyond your abilities. Remember, they're gifts — so using them effectively just proves the power of the Giver. Because,

Neither the one who *plants* nor the one who *waters* is anything, but *only God*, who makes things grow. – 1 Corinthians 3:7 NIV

We wield our maximum power when we serve our created purpose – but when we see that our effect is boosted by being in the body, we should feel humbled, and after that, grateful as well!



So, are you serving with gratitude? If you're using your abilities to their full extent, your experience should be a blessing – because you should feel honored that your part is important. Remember, the fulfilment of finding your place and purpose is only due to God giving you the capacity to seize your big opportunity – so thank the Lord!

[The same way Paul acknowledges the blessing of his role] I became a servant of this Gospel by the *gift of God's grace* given me through the working of *His power*. – Ephesians 3:7 NIV

Ever been frustrated cuz you gave someone a present and they thank you but they don't use it? Well, using our gifts shows we value them! If we're grateful for our gifts we should be eager to use them!



So, are you serving with excitement? If you're living the life you were designed to lead, your satisfaction should energize your actions. Because you should be thrilled to participate in perfection! Remember, plenty of people live their whole lives discouraged by the feeling of squandered skills, but in Christ, we get to feel our abilities come to full fruition! So

Never be lacking in zeal, but keep your spiritual fervor, serving the Lord. – Romans 12:11 NIV

It's exciting for the purpose that reveals why you are who you are – but it's more exciting to see how your service fulfills God's plan! Cuz bringing others hope isn't just energizing, it's enjoyable!



So, are you serving with joy? If you can see how your skills can play a part in leading others to their purpose, you should be happy to do it. Because you should see your responsibility as your heart's desire. Remember, when we serve others with our purpose, we're not just helping them, we're letting the Lord lead us to the satisfaction of our true identity. So

Blessed are those ... who find great delight in [the Lord's] commands. - Psalms 112:1 NIV

The same way that Eric Liddel said *he* felt *God's pleasure* when he *ran*, *we too*, get to feel *that joy* when **God** *transforms* our *ordinary tasks* into *meaningful service* by *connecting* it to our *purpose*. And when we *see* there's *someone behind* that *joy* we can't help but respond with *love*.



So, are you serving with love? If what you do for others agrees with who God created you to be, love should motivate you to serve. Because you should want to reproduce what you received. Remember, what's good for one part is good for the whole body, and because God's love is what gave you purpose and power, loving others helps us all:

<u>Serve one another humbly in love</u>. For the entire law is fulfilled in keeping this one command: "Love your neighbor as yourself." – Galatians 5:13-14 NIV

When we serve purely for the *benefit* of *others*, expecting nothing *in return*, we *embody* the purpose God created us *for*—and we *become* the body of *Christ* that God can reunite *with!*

Cuz genuine service comes from a heart confident in God, filled with faith and gratitude, carried out in humility and joy, marked by eager excitement, and above all, driven by love. So, even if you're serving, if you aren't experiencing these dimensions – expand your efforts! Ask yourself and others what skills God has specifically given you and then explore the opportunities that might maximize your impact!
