Vital Signs

Created to Believe
March 30, 2025



Today we're examining how we live to reveal what we believe. Cuz, as Bruce said last week, we're all gonna stand before the throne of Christ and we're all gonna give an account for how we lived our life! And that discussion will involve how well we fulfilled the five created purposes we all share: believing, belonging, becoming, branching, and bestowing. And since the stakes are so high and the subjects are so deep — we're starting a little series to assess our progress toward each purpose. And today we're diving deeper into what we believe. But because there's a self-serving bias in how we perceive what we believe, we need to ask the more direct question behind that question: What's at the center of your life?



Because everyone has to live for something – because something has to give our life purpose. Because purpose is a uniquely human need that begins with belief. No cow has ever questioned its existence, failed to find meaning, and lost its will to live – but every human needs to believe in something that gives them a reason to get out of bed every morning.



And what we believe doesn't have to be spiritual, intellectual, or even rational — it just has to feed our appetite for purpose enough to make life worth living. For me, I remember how just the thought of being a rockstar was enough motivation to tolerate the rest of my misery. So I grew out my hair, practiced guitar, and started bands to make myself believe in the reality of my reason. And slowly, I grew more and more faith that music was my purpose — and that it would reward me with fame and fortune if I just made it the center of my life.

Cuz whether it's an object, an achievement, a profession, or a person — we all believe something exists that will reward us with purpose when we faithfully pursue it! And that's because it's true... but only in one case:


Without *faith* it is impossible to please <u>God</u>, because anyone who comes to <u>Him must believe</u> that <u>He</u> exists and that <u>He</u> rewards those who earnestly <u>seek Him</u>. – Hebrews 11:6 NIV

Y'see, regardless of what we believe gives us purpose, we can all agree that we need to believe we have a purpose – but **God** says He created us with a need to believe for a purpose. Cuz:

He *Himself* gives everyone life and breath and *everything else* ... and He marked out their appointed times in history and the boundaries of their lands. [But,] God did this so that they would seek Him and perhaps reach out for Him and find Him – Acts 17:25, 27 NIV

For He chose us in Him before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in His sight. In love He predestined us [believers] for adoption to sonship through Jesus Christ, in accordance with His pleasure and will — Ephesians 1:4-5 NIV

You get it? It's easier than it sounds; believing in God's purpose is the purpose of being created to believe. That is, He designed us with an appetite to believe in something so we'd see only He has something worth believing. Cuz He offers adoption back into the family we were born to be in!



However, because we live in a world full of other things that also promise to fulfill our purpose, we get distracted by different pursuits, hoping they'll lead us where we belong. Yet our constant searching through all of human history should be a clear sign that this world can't provide what we want. And this idea was echoed by award-winning, best-selling novelist David Foster Wallace, who lost his life-long struggle to find that reason in 2008 when he committed suicide. And though he considered making Jesus his reason twice, he couldn't let go of this world's constant letdowns — which he hinted at, in a now-famous commencement speech:

"There is actually no such thing as atheism ... Everybody worships. The only choice we get is what to worship. And ... pretty much anything you worship will eat you alive. If you worship money and things ... then you will never have enough ... Worship your own body ... and you will always feel ugly ... Worship power [and] you will feel weak and afraid ... Worship your intellect, ... [and] you will end up feeling stupid, a fraud, always on the verge of being found out."

Cuz the bottom line is this: **believing** *this world* **can fulfill** *us* **only leads to** *disappointment* **and** *death*. And *that's* because the *only* purpose *worth* believing is found *outside* this world – *in* a relationship with *God*. After all, real *fulfillment* can only come from satisfying a *created* purpose – and if we are *created* beings, *logically*, **only** *our* **Creator knows the** *real* **reason we were made!** And without *His reason* at the center of *our lives*, we're all *doomed* to the *despair* of *dysfunction*. Cuz the same way it would be annoying to use a *clarinet* as a *spoon* – it would be *frustrating* for *Mozart* to waste his life *digging ditches*. So, we need to *reconnect* with our Creator to *align* with *His intentions*.

But, since our fundamental problem stems from the *separation* that *began* when *we* parted ways with our Creator, *He* had to let us *learn* to return *on our own terms*, however *painful* the process:

For the creation was subjected to *frustration*, not by its own choice, but by the will of the *One* who subjected it, in *hope* that the creation itself will be liberated from its bondage to decay and brought into the freedom and glory of the children of God. – Romans 8:20-21 NIV



God allows us to believe lies so the mistakes can turn us back toward truth. It's like the father who urged the prodigal son to stay home but still let him foolishly chase worldly fulfillment — hoping that the letdown would bring him back where he belonged. Well, we too need to learn that only the Lord knows the right way to lead our life.

Cuz *faith* in *our Father* is the only *belief* that can lead *us* back where *we* belong. We must learn to *trust* Him enough to *involve* Him in *every* decision and *believe* all *His answers*.

Cuz that's what kids should do, and He said we were created to be His kids. Remember, "He predestined us for adoption to sonship through Jesus Christ" Cuz Christ modeled the power of believing in God's purpose for our lives – by proving that His love conquers all – even death! Because spoiler alert – we were created to be loved. That's what we have to believe! And only when we believe we're beloved will we be living out our purpose. Cuz when God wanted to fully express His love – He made YOU to do it! So don't you ever forget: we were all made for Him.

[Like John said:] You [God] created all things, and <u>by Your will</u> they were created and have their being. [and God didn't have to create us, He wanted to create us] — Revelation 4:11 NIV

For the LORD takes *delight* in His people – Psalms 149:4 NIV



The same way we take delight in the people we create when we decide to have kids. For instance, even though Rayna and I would be perfectly happy with just the two of us, we thought it would be delightful to fill our house with more humans. And for the most part, we were right! Loving our kids has brought us loads of joy and hopefully, one day it'll bring them joy too. They just need to learn to believe that love can feel like torture sometimes! But then again, so do we!



Because one of the biggest *obstructions* to *our* belief in *God's* love is all the *suffering* we feel. But like our *own* kids, **suffering only** *discourages* **those who** *doubt* **their parent's heart.** Cuz if we *truly believed* in *God's* purpose, we'd *trust* that His *love* was behind everything *we* experience – including the *rough stuff!* Just like *kids* should know *chores*, *bedtimes*, and *vegetables* are all part of *their* parents' love – in spite of *how* it *feels*.

So, even though it can be hard to believe that we *were* created for an *eternal*, *loving* relationship that brings perfect joy to *everyone* involved – remember, we have to *believe* in God's love to *take part* in God's love.

Think about it, you won't have a happy marriage if you don't trust your spouse's vows; so, likewise, we can't enjoy God's plan without first believing in His promise. So thank the Lord that Jesus came and proved God's promise of eternal adoption was worth trusting!

The Son of God has come and has given us understanding, so that we may know Him who is true. And we are in Him who is true by being in His Son Jesus Christ. He is the true God and eternal life. [So,] Dear children, keep yourselves from idols. – 1 John 5:18-21 NIV



When Jesus came, we were given a tangible example of the value of God's love – by seeing its effect as the center of our life. And that's an enormous help when we decide what to worship. Cuz again, what we believe in decides how we turn out. In fact, you know where we get the word worship? It's just an old English mashup of 'worth' and 'shape'.

Worship literally means worth's shape or the shaping of worth. Your worship is what you think and feel represents value itself; it's what you give to things you deem worthy.

Because as we all know, worship's main meaning manifests in its action. In fact, the Bible's Hebrew and Greek words for worship mean to bow, prostrate, or serve — cuz worship is something you 'do' in response to something you value. Worship means letting something's worth shape you. It means somehow changing yourself to acknowledge and accommodate something else that has great value to you.



So, stop and think about it; what are you letting change you? Has the way you value money influenced any of your decisions? How about the importance of your career? Does it have an affect on your daily life? What weight do you give to people's approval? Or your authority?

Because what you value will determine how you do you. And whether it's a person that you tell, "You are my whole world! You're my reason for living!" or a possession that makes you feel, "This will complete me. This will fix all my problems!" – believing that either are worthy enough to let them shape you – is worship. You might not call it that, but when you give something in your life the power to change you, you've begun a worship relationship. And the higher the value, the harder it is to contain the change – so make sure what you give your worship gives you your real purpose – cuz there's only room for one at the center of your life!

[So, as Paul says:] Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of *God's mercy*, to offer *your* bodies as a *living* sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your *true* and *proper worship*. – Romans 12:1 NIV

So, what's at the center of your life? Whatever your answer, that's the object of your worship. Cuz when we believe that something can give us purpose, we give it our life. And like David Foster Wallace said, "Everybody worships. The only choice we get is what to worship."

But the very fact that we were all born with that need to believe should be seen as a conspicuous clue to turn us toward a Creator. Because if God has given us the capacity for faith – but also the free will to misplace our faith – it's only logical that part of our purpose is to choose what we believe. And while believing in the empty promises of worldly idols has always proven to let us down, Jesus proved that believing in God produces a love that fulfills our deepest desires.

Because when we believe in *God*, it's not just an intellectual decision, it's a humble recognition that only our *Creator* truly knows how we're meant to live. And the moment we choose to let Him lead, everything changes – we find our way back to the path we were created to walk and discover that faithfully following leads us to the life-changing love we see we need. And when we respond with worship, we let His love shape us into the eternal family we were meant to be. Cuz God created us to be loved, to know we're loved, and to be driven by His love – but that all begins with believing in His love. Cuz only that belief fulfills our created purpose when it becomes the center of our life.

[So, as John says:] Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God ... because God is love. – 1 John 4:7-8 NIV

Father God, thank You for loving me in spite of my sin; forgive me and cleanse me by the sacrifice of Your Son, my Savior; and free me and lead me by Your Spirit and Word, as I seek to trust and follow Jesus Christ, as the Lord of my life. Amen.
