Vital Signs IV



Created to Branch Out

Today we're questioning *the condition* of our *connections*. Cuz, as we've *discussed* in this little "spiritual physical" series, we all have an appointment to stand alone before Christ's throne and answer for our actions – and though we don't know the specific questions, we do know it'll involve how we used our God-given life to fulfill our 5 God-given purposes to believe, belong, become, branch out, and bestow. And, since we've already tackled the first three, it's time to look into how we're branching out! And that means honestly assessing, what are you offering to others?











Last week Bruce gave an Easter message about how Moses' snake on a pole was a foreshadow of Jesus on the cross – and how *each* offered *healing* to anyone who would just *turn* and *trust*. And although the insights were *awesome* and *illuminating*, today, I'd like to emphasize where the similarities *stop*. And you know what one of the *biggest* differences is between our *Savior* and a *snake?* Arms. *Seriously*.


Cuz arms are the instruments of outreach and without 'em, you literally can't reach out! Which would be a problem for the kind of Savior us humans need! Sure, a lot of our problems have solutions that can be found through diligent seeking alone – but for the big ones, people need their help to meet 'em halfway! Someone's gotta reach out when what we need is out of our reach. Cuz some situations don't have attainable answers that are set up like a snake on a pole for us to find on our own; some situations are made to be beyond our control to teach us to rely on the relationships that are within our reach. And that's where other people come in – when someone realizes they need someone else. And I hate to break it to you – but you're someone else to everybody else. And some of them – need you to survive.

You know that *scene* in TV shows where the more *reserved* main character is out to *dinner* and someone starts choking, so our *reluctant* hero is *forced* to *clumsily* try the Heimlich maneuver for the first time? *It's like that!* Whether we want to or *not*, we were *created* with an *obligation* to *reach out* and step *in* when we can offer any kind of assistance. I know, cuz it happened to *me!*

A few years ago, I was at the youth retreat in Leavenworth, at cheese shop, when one of the leaders turned beet red and stopped talking. So, I kinda smiled and said, "What, are you choking?" and they nodded... And I said, "What – seriously?!" and they nodded much faster! So I spun around to see if any other cheese mongers were stepping in – but only found a room full of blank, frozen faces. And for exactly three seconds, a million thoughts ran through my head; "I don't know the Heimlich" "Is this a joke?" "What if I try and fail?" "Do I have to?" And then, something in me grabbed him, spun him, and started Heimliching like there was no tomorrow; I almost passed out – and then the food came out! And all I could think was, "I can't believe that worked!" Cuz I had no idea what I was doing!

But in *hindsight*, I think that's *why* it worked. Because I *wasn't* the one *doing* it. The *physical* me was busy asking *questions* and working up *worry* while someone *else* – *in me* – took *action*. And I think that *someone* was named "Love" cuz in case you forgot *who* we are:





[And] God is love. – 1 John 4:16 NIV



Which means the core character of our created identity is designed to represent and reproduce love. And therefore, we require relationships to feel fulfilled. So, when obvious opportunities for love arise, the instincts of our true identity kick in and tell us to reach out. And although stopping someone from choking to death has gotta be one of the most obvious opportunities to express the simplest form love — it does echo the character of our Creator when our situation grew beyond our abilities.



Cuz we may hate to admit it, but each one of us is slowly having the life choked out of us by this world. Cuz down here, everyone who goes toe to toe with death alone, takes the loss; unless we reach out for a relationship with Jesus. Cuz He didn't just defeat His death by evading sin, He disarmed it once and for all by coming here to bring eternal life within everyone's reach!



[As Paul says:] "Death has been swallowed up in victory. Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" The sting of death is *sin*, and the *power* of sin is the *law*. But thanks be to God! He gives *us* the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. – 1 Corinthians 15:53-57 NIV



Cuz when Jesus died on the cross, He paid for sin, fulfilled the law, and brought God's life-saving love to every soul willing to concede their need and receive His help! And when He froze in that pose, we were given a perfect picture of how God branches out to offer His assistance: with open arms, extended as an invitation to salvation! Cuz that's the love at the core of our Creator's character and that's the image we were created to copy; God's love, branching out! Cuz God said:

I am going to bring My servant, the Branch. [And then Jesus said:] – Zechariah 3:8 NIV

As the Father has sent Me, [the Branch] I am sending you. – John 20:21 NIV



Which makes *us* branches of *the branch* and begs the *question*: how do *we* branch like *the Branch* branched? Well, believe it or not, like a branch! And here's how *they* work: *first*, **branches** *establish* a strong *connection* to their *root* and only *after* that, **branches** *share their root* by *producing fruit*.

So, in the *same* way *Jesus* used *His* connection to *God* to bring *God* to *us* – *we* **gotta strengthen** *our* **connection with** *Jesus* **so we can bring** *Jesus* **to** *others*. Which is *why*, when Jesus was *asked*,

"Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?" Jesus replied: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: Love your neighbor as yourself.' All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments." — Matthew 22:36-40 NIV


Because it *only* takes *these two* steps to *branch out* like the *branch* we were *born* to *be*. We simply **love the** *Lord* **to** *connect* **to** *our root*, so we can **love** *others* **by sharing** *His fruit!* As Jesus *goes on*:

I am the vine; you are the branches. [So, in the same way plants grow] If you remain in Me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; [but] apart from Me you can do nothing. — John 15:5 NIV



Sure can't! Can I share a secret with you? I'm not that great. I've got more issues than National Geographic and if I were up here on my own, none of you would want to hear what I have to say. You're only here because of my connection to someone else worth listening to; Jesus! And that same connection is open to all of us so we can all have something worth sharing. And that's the goal, cuz branches are all about growth! In fact, branches don't exist on their own cuz a branch's whole purpose is to extend the vine!







"My food," said [God's branch,] Jesus, "is to do the will of Him who sent Me – John 4:34 NIV

And *likewise*, we *know* the will of the *divine* Vine who sent us to branch out in *His image*:

This is to My Father's glory, that <u>you</u> bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be *My disciples*. "As the Father has loved *Me*, so have I loved <u>you</u>. Now <u>remain</u> in My love... [cuz now it's <u>your turn</u>, and] *My* command is <u>this</u>: <u>Love each other</u> as I have loved you. – John 15:8-9,12 NIV

That is, "Branch out to bring others God's love the way I came to you to bring you God's love." Cuz only feeding others produces the love that fulfills our identity! That's why it feels good to give even though it means having less and that's why our food is to do the will of the One who sent us!

Remember, your fruit is just a function of your root – so whatever you have to offer is just the unique flavor that Jesus's love takes on as it passes through your branch.

Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. – 1 John 4:7 NIV

[Which means] We love because He first loved us. – 1 John 4:19 NIV

We're just passing it on! Like we read earlier, God <u>is</u> love – and since <u>our image</u> is meant to be <u>His image</u>, <u>our love</u> is meant to be <u>His love</u>. Because, with the <u>first</u> Branch,

God was reconciling the *world* to *Himself* in *Christ* ... [But now] He has committed to us the message of reconciliation. We are therefore *Christ's ambassadors*, as though God were making His appeal through us. – 2 Corinthians 5:19-20 NIV

As we grow into our intended image, we get to do what Jesus did and branch out as the open arms of God that bring the life-saving help humans need, within reach. We get to be ambassadors of the love of God that has the power to pull everyone out of their duel with death. We get to be the arms that reach out and give a spiritual Heimlich to every person gasping for air as they choke on all the flavorless food this unfulfilling world offers. What an honor! And what a responsibility!



Cuz every one of you in this room is only here because someone, at some time, somehow shared God's love in a way that moved you to attend today. And just like Jesus, it only happened when they went out of their way to get out of God's way, so He could use their specific branch to entice you toward His root. So now it's our turn! Because



[Jesus] died for *all*, [so] that those who *live* should *no longer* live for *themselves* but *for Him* who died for them ... – 2 Corinthians 5:15 NIV



[The way Paul says:] I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I now live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me – Galatians 2:20 NIV



So is that you? Are you letting Jesus use your life to offer others the love that saved you? That's what it means to be a branch. You weren't saved to become a dead end, you were saved to become the beginning of another life. Like Jesus, our job is to branch out and track down every struggling soul in hopes that it'll be our specific fruit that attracts them to the root of our love. And that's where the fun begins!



Because being an ambassador doesn't mean you're just a gobetween; it means you're a branch manager! Cuz, like we said, it may be God's love that we grow, but it's our life that gives it flavor. And in the same way the same sun grows apples and oranges, God's love can grow a plethora of different produce. So our job is to fill our branch with a new fruit that's bound to be someone's new favorite!

Because we each offer fruit perfectly suited to someone's appetite. And it's an awesome feeling to connect with the particular people with a hunger for your one-of-a-kind cuisine — cuz together, we create a whole crowd of fulfilled diners and satisfied servers. Like when I was a bartender, our place was packed because our staff each had our own appeal and therefore, our own regulars; the ones who kept coming back because of a shared connection. Tonya was our young flirty firecracker — so she got all the Navy guys. Jeremy was easy-going, good-looking chuckle-head — so he handled all the college kids — and I was... well y'all know me — so I got the sarcastic smartalecs, sassy secretaries, and sweet grannies (who are secretly the best tippers)!

But my point is this: there's a group of regulars literally dying for a taste of what you're serving! And if you wouldn't walk by someone choking in a cheese shop, how can you ignore those around you spiritually suffering when you have the power to be the branch that brings eternal life within reach? You can't. You just have to let God's love take action while you worry – cuz nobody said it'd be easy that's why they call it "going out on a limb!" But God promises it'll be fruitful and fulfilling!
